13	Section 1. Section 41-22-9 is amended to read:

15	The following off-highway vehicles are exempt from the registration requirements of this
16	chapter:
17	(1) vehicles that are currently registered for highway use, have a valid motor vehicle safety
18	inspection sticker or certificate, and on which the required safety equipment has not been
19	subsequently modified;
20	(2) off-highway vehicles, except snowmobiles, that are not in the state more than 14 days
21	in any year and are owned by a nonresident;
22	(3) snowmobiles that are owned by a nonresident and that are displaying a current [annual]
23	snowmobile user fee decal in accordance with Section 41-22-35;
24	(4) off-highway vehicles sold by a dealer to a person who is not a resident of this state;
25	(5) off-highway implements of husbandry operated in the manner prescribed by

29	Section 2. Section 41-22-35 is amended to read:
30	41-22-35. Snowmobile user fee Decal Agents Penalty for fraudulent issuance
31	of decal Deposit and use of fee revenue.
32	(1) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (1)(b), any nonresident owning a snowmobile
33	who operates or gives another person permission to operate the snowmobile on any public land,
34	trail, street, or highway in this state shall pay [an annual] a snowmobile user fee.
35	(b) A snowmobile registered in a state that offers reciprocal operating privileges to Utah
36	residents pursuant to rules of the board is exempt from the [annual] snowmobile user fee.
37	(2) The snowmobile user fee shall be [\$30.]:
38	(i) \$5 for a seven-day decal;
39	(ii) \$15 for a 30-day decal; and
40	(iii) \$30 for an annual decal.
41	(3) The board may establish procedures for the payment of snowmobile user fees by rule.
