14	Section 1. Section 58-1-301.5 is enacted to read:
15	58-1-301.5. Division access to Bureau of Criminal Identification records.
16	(1) The division shall have direct access to criminal background information maintained
17	by the Bureau of Criminal Identification under Chapter 53, Chapter 10, Part 2, Bureau of Criminal
18	Identification, for background screening of licensure applicants as required in:
19	(a) Section 58-47b-302 of Title 58, Chapter 47b, Massage Therapy Practice Act;
20	(b) Section 58-55-302 of Title 58, Chapter 55, Construction Trades Licensing, as it applies
21	to alarm companies and alarm company agents; and
22	(c) Section 58-63-302 of Title 58, Chapter 63, Security Personnel Licensing Act.
23	(2) The division access under Subsection (1) shall be in accordance with Section
24	<u>53-10-108.</u>
25	Section 2. Effective date.
26	If approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, this act takes effect
27	upon approval by the governor, or the day following the constitutional time limit of Utah

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- 28 Constitution Article VII, Section 8, without the governor's signature, or in the case of a veto, the
- 29 <u>date of veto override.</u>
