19	(a) an identification of the advantages and disadvantages of using classroom amplification
20	devices; and
21	(b) an evaluation of the effects of using classroom amplification devices on students'
22	academic performance.
23	(2) By November 1, 2002, the state superintendent of public instruction shall submit a
24	report of the study, along with recommendations regarding the use of classroom amplification
25	devices, to the Education Interim Committee.
