6	This act creates the Access to Health Care and Coverage Task Force. The act specifies
7	membership, responsibilities, and reporting dates for the task force. The act appropriates
8	\$37,000 from the General Fund for fiscal year 2001-02 to fund the task force and repeals the
9	task force on November 30, 2002.
10	This act enacts uncodified material.
11	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
12	Section 1. Access to health care and coverage Findings Creation Membership
13	Quorum Compensation Staff.
14	(1) There is created the Access to Health Care and Coverage Task Force consisting of the
15	following ten members:
16	(a) three members of the Senate appointed by the president of the Senate, no more than
17	two of whom may be from the same political party;
18	(b) five members of the House of Representatives appointed by the speaker of the House
19	of Representatives, no more than three of whom may be from the same political party;
20	(c) the executive director of the Department of Health or his designee; and
21	(d) the commissioner of the Department of Insurance or his designee.
22	(2) (a) The president of the Senate shall designate a member of the Senate appointed under
23	Subsection (1)(a) as a cochair of the task force.
24	(b) The speaker of the House of Representatives shall designate a member of the House
25	of Representatives appointed under Subsection (1)(b) as a cochair of the task force.
26	(3) A majority of the members of the task force constitute a quorum. The action of a
27	majority of a quorum constitutes the action of the task force

28	(4) (a) Salaries and expenses of the members of the task force who are legislators shall be
29	paid in accordance with Section 36-2-2 and Legislative Joint Rule 15.03.
30	(b) A member of the task force who is not a legislator may not receive compensation for
31	their work associated with the task force, but may receive per diem and reimbursement for travel
32	expenses incurred as a member of the task force at the rates established by the Division of Finance
33	under Sections 63A-3-106 and 63A-3-107.
34	(5) The Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel shall provide staff support to
35	the task force.
36	Section 2. Duties Interim report.
37	(1) The task force shall review and make recommendations on the following:
38	(a) options for improving access to health care coverage and access to primary care for
39	Utah's uninsured population that:
40	(i) focus attention on those who are most in need;
41	(ii) strike an appropriate and effective balance between private and public sector
42	approaches including employer, employee, and public sector partnerships; and
43	(iii) build on existing systems of proven effectiveness;
44	(b) the implementation and design of the Department of Health's "Covering the Uninsured
45	2000" grant process and recommendations; and
46	(c) the state's progress in implementing Medicaid waivers and health care access programs
47	(2) (a) In reviewing and making its recommendations, the task force shall:
48	(i) receive input from stake holders in the health care system;
49	(ii) consider the costs and potential savings associated with each option it recommends
50	under Subsection (1)(a); and
51	(iii) consider the effect of each option recommended under Subsection (1)(a) on
52	cost-shifting, uncompensated care, and existing programs and systems.
53	(b) A final report, including any proposed legislation, shall be presented to the Health and
54	Human Services Interim Committee before November 30, 2002.
55	Section 3. Appropriation.
56	There is appropriated from the General Fund for fiscal year 2001-02:
57	(1) \$4,500 to the Senate to pay for the compensation and expenses of senators on the task

59	(2) \$7,500 to the House of Representatives to pay for the compensation and expenses of
50	representatives on the task force; and
51	(3) \$25,000 to the Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel to pay for staffing
52	the task force.
53	Section 4. Repeal date.
54	This act is repealed November 30, 2002.
