14	(1) The total amount of bonds issued under this part may not exceed [\$109,500,000]					
15	<u>\$161,200,000</u> .					
16	(2) (a) Proceeds from the issuance of bonds shall be provided to the division to provide					
17	funds to pay all or part of the cost of acquiring and constructing the projects listed in this					
18	Subsection (2).					
19	(b) These costs may include the cost of acquiring land, interests in land, easements and					
20	rights-of-way, improving sites, and acquiring, constructing, equipping, and furnishing facilities and					
21	all structures, roads, parking facilities, utilities, and improvements necessary, incidental, or					
22	convenient to the facilities, interest estimated to accrue on these bonds during the period to be					
23	covered by construction of the projects plus a period of six months after the end of the construction					
24	period, and all related engineering, architectural, and legal fees.

58	(b) The division shall make those expenditures from unexpended and unencumbered

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- (c) The division shall reimburse the Capital Projects Fund upon receipt of the proceeds of bonds issued under this chapter.
- (d) The commission may, by resolution, make any statement of intent relating to that reimbursement that is necessary or desirable to comply with federal tax law.

## Section 2. Effective date.

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If approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, this act takes effect upon approval by the governor, or the day following the constitutional time limit of Utah Constitution Article VII, Section 8, without the governor's signature, or in the case of a veto, the date of veto override.
