CANVASS FOR PROVISIONAL BALLOT

S.B. 5001

THIS ACT MODIFIES THE ELECTION CODE BY MODIFYING THE CANVASS DATES FOR PRIMARY AND GENERAL ELECTIONS. THIS ACT TAKES EFFECT IMMEDIATELY, was read for the first time and referred to the Rules Committee.
