

HOUSE JOURNAL

FIRST DAY

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The House was called to order by Speaker Stephens at 8:45 a.m.

Roll call showed all members present except Representatives Roger Barrus, Carol Spackman-Moss, Sheryl Allen, Matt Throckmorton, and Scott Daniels, excused.

Pledge of Allegiance and prayer by Representative Brent D. Parker.

On motion of Representative Hatch, the House voted to continue with the same organization for the Fifth Special Session of the 54th Legislature as set up and constituted during the Annual General Session of the Legislature insofar as it pertains to the Speakership, Majority Leadership, with the exception of the Majority Leader, and Minority Leadership.

On motion of Representative Becker, the House voted to spread upon the pages of the House Journal that the Majority Caucus has elected Representative Tom Hatch as Majority Leader and Representative Afton B. Bradshaw has been appointed by the Speaker to serve as Rules Committee Chair.

Speaker Martin R. Stephens appointed Carole E. Peterson as Chief Clerk.

The Chief Clerk read the certification and proclamation.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, since the adjournment of the 2002 General Session of the Fifty-Fourth Legislature of the State of Utah, matters have arisen which require immediate legislative attention; and

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 6 of the Constitution of the State of Utah provides that the Governor may, by proclamation, convene the Legislature into Special Session;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MICHAEL O. LEAVITT, Governor of the State of Utah, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the Laws of the State of Utah, do by this Proclamation call the Fifty-fourth Legislature of the State of Utah into a Fifth Special Session at the State Capitol at Salt Lake City, Utah, on the 26th day of June, 2002, at 8:30 a.m., for the following purposes:

1. To fund the Fiscal Year 2003 budget and consider amendments to the budget reserve account.
2. To reconsider HB 25, Adult Protective Services Amendments, passed in the 2002 general session for the purpose of making technical corrections.
3. To reconsider the timing of county canvassing, as amended by SB 36, Provisional Ballot, in the 2002 general session.
4. To consider amending the law on the collection, maintenance, and reporting of data by the courts with respect to driving under the influence cases.
5. To consider approving the proposed 2002 federal- Utah state trust lands consolidation agreement.
6. To consider authorizing a local political subdivision to call a local special election for determining voter approval of a change in Utah's legal boundaries.
7. And, to consider such other measures as may be brought to the attention of the Legislature by supplemental communication from the Governor before or during the Special Session hereby called.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS

On motion of Representative Bradshaw, the House voted to adopt the same House Rules and Joint Rules for the Fifth Special Session of the 54th Legislature as adopted in the Annual General Session of 2002.

On motion of Representative Becker, the House voted to authorize the Speaker to appoint a committee to wait upon the Senate to inform that Honorable Body that the House is organized and ready to do business. The Speaker appointed Representatives Holdaway, Clark, and Beshear.

On motion of Representative Curtis, the House voted to authorize the Speaker to appoint a committee to act with a like committee from the Senate to wait upon the Governor to inform His Excellency that the Legislature is organized and ready to receive any communication or message he may have to offer. The speaker appointed Representatives Johnson, Dayton, and Arent.

On motion of Representative Hatch, the House voted, under suspension of the rules, to suspend the reading of formal titles of all House and Senate Bills and House and Senate Resolutions.

Representative Johnson informed the House of Representatives that his joint committee had waited upon the Governor and informed him that the Legislature was organized and ready to do business.

Representative Holdaway informed the House of Representatives that his committee had waited upon the Senate and informed them that the House was organized and ready to do business.

Senators Hickman, R. Allen, and Jenkins formally notified the House of Representatives that the Senate was organized and ready to do business.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS

On motion of Representative Hatch, and with the consent of the Senate, the House voted to adjourn until July 8, 2002, at 2:00 p.m.
