INDIVIDUAL INCOME TAX - ESTIMATED TAX PAYMENTS

its business and was prepared to adjourn sine die. The Speaker appointed Representatives Dayton, Philpot, and Fife.

Representative Fife reported that his committee had waited upon the Senate and they were prepared to adjourn sine die.

On motion of Representative Hatch, the Speaker was authorized to appoint a committee to wait upon the Governor and inform him that the House had completed its business and was prepared to adjourn sine die. The Speaker appointed Representatives Throckmorton, Way, and Duckworth.

Representative Throckmorton reported that his committee had waited upon the Governor and he had no message to bring before the House.

Senators M. Peterson, Steele, and Eastman formally notified the House that the Senate had completed its business and was prepared to adjourn sine die.

On motion of Representative Hatch, and at 11:45 p.m., the House of Representatives of the Fifty-fourth Legislature adjourned the Fifth Special Session, sine die.

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
