6 **This act amends the State System of Public Education. The act provides that after a**
7 **certain time period elementary schools may sell only certain food products through**
8 **vending machines on premises accessible to students.**

9 This act affects sections of Utah Code Annotated 1953 as follows:

10 ENACTS:

11 **53A-15-1001**, Utah Code Annotated 1953

12 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

13 Section 1. Section **53A-15-1001** is enacted to read:

14 **Part 10. Promoting Nutrition**

15 **53A-15-1001. Vending machines.**

16 (1) After the date specified in Subsection (2), an elementary school may not sell, or
17 allow to be sold, through vending machines on premises accessible to students food products
18 other than water, milk, 100% fruit juice, or fresh fruit.

19 (2) The requirements of Subsection (1) shall be met upon the first to occur of the
20 following:

21 (a) the natural expiration or earlier termination of a school's contracts in force with
22 vending machine suppliers; or

23 (b) May 5, 2006.

State Impact
