

1 **LICENSE PLATE FOR BOYS AND GIRLS**

2 **CLUBS**

3 2003 GENERAL SESSION

4 STATE OF UTAH

5 **Sponsor: Chad E. Bennion**

6 **This act modifies the Motor Vehicle Code by adding a Boys and Girls Clubs of America**
7 **special group license plate to provide financial support to the Utah Alliance of Boys and**
8 **Girls Clubs, Inc. This act requires applicants for the new plate to make a \$25 annual**
9 **donation to the Utah Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs, Inc. This act requires Utah**
10 **Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs, Inc. to pay a \$6,000 fee to the Motor Vehicle Division to**
11 **cover startup materials and programming costs. This act exempts Boys and Girls Clubs**
12 **of America special group license plates from a \$50 initial special group license plate fee**
13 **and from a \$10 renewal special group license plate fee. This act makes technical**
14 **corrections. This act takes effect on October 1, 2003. This act provides a coordination**
15 **clause.**

16 This act affects sections of Utah Code Annotated 1953 as follows:

21 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

22 Section 1. Section **41-1a-408** is amended to read:

23 **41-1a-408. Special group plates -- Design -- Application -- Issuance.**

24 (1) As used in this section:

25 (a) "Boy Scouts of America license plates" means the special group license plates
26 issued under this section to a contributor to the Boy Scouts of America.

27 (b) "Boys and Girls Clubs of America" means the special group license plates issued



28 under this section to a contributor to the Utah Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs, Inc. after
29 payment of the appropriate fees.

30 [~~(b)~~] (c) "Children's issues license plates" means the special group license plates issued
31 under this section to a contributor to the Guardian Ad Litem Services Account and the
32 Children's Museum of Utah.

33 [~~(c)~~] (d) "Collegiate license plates" means the special group license plates issued under
34 this section to a contributor to an institution after payment of the appropriate fees.

35 [~~(d)~~] (e) (i) "Contributor" means a person who has donated or in whose name at least
36 \$25 has been donated to:

37 (A) a scholastic scholarship fund of a single institution;

38 (B) the Division of Veterans' Affairs in the Utah National Guard for veterans'
39 programs;

40 (C) the Division of Wildlife Resources for conservation of wildlife and the
41 enhancement, preservation, protection, access, and management of wildlife habitat;

42 (D) the Department of Agriculture and Food for the benefit of soil conservation
43 districts;

44 (E) the Division of Parks and Recreation for the benefit of snowmobile programs;

45 (F) the Guardian Ad Litem Services Account and the Children's Museum of Utah, with
46 the donation evenly divided between the two;

47 (G) the Boy Scouts of America for the benefit of a Utah Boy Scouts of America
48 council as specified by the contributor; [~~or~~]

49 (H) No More Homeless Pets in Utah for distribution to organizations or individuals
50 that provide spay and neuter programs that subsidize the sterilization of domestic animals[~~;~~]; or

51 (I) the Utah Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs, Inc. to provide and enhance youth
52 development programs.

53 (ii) Except as provided under Subsection (13), the donation must be made in the 12
54 months prior to registration or renewal of registration.

55 [~~(e)~~] (f) "Institution" means a state institution of higher education or a private
56 institution of higher education in the state accredited by a regional or national accrediting
57 agency recognized by the United States Department of Education.

58 [~~(f)~~] (g) "Snowmobile license plates" means the special group license plates issued

59 under this section to a contributor to the Division of Parks and Recreation after payment of the
60 appropriate fees.

61 ~~[(g)]~~ (h) "Soil conservation license plates" means the special group license plates
62 issued under this section to a contributor to the Department of Agriculture and Food after
63 payment of the appropriate fees.

64 ~~[(h)]~~ (i) "Spay and neuter license plates" means the special group license plates issued
65 under this section to a contributor to spay and neuter programs through No More Homeless
66 Pets in Utah after payment of the appropriate fees.

67 ~~[(i)]~~ (j) "State institution of higher education" has the same meaning as provided in
68 Section 53B-3-102.

69 ~~[(j)]~~ (k) "Veterans' license plates" means the special group license plates issued under
70 this section to a contributor to the Office of Veterans' Affairs after payment of the appropriate
71 fees.

72 ~~[(k)]~~ (l) "Wildlife license plates" means the special group license plates issued under
73 this section to a contributor to the Division of Wildlife Resources after payment of the
74 appropriate fees.

75 (2) (a) The design and maximum number of numerals or characters on special group
76 license plates shall be determined by the division in accordance with the criteria in Subsection
77 (2)(b).

78 (b) Except for Olympic special group license plates, each special group license plate
79 shall display:

80 (i) the word Utah;

81 (ii) the name or identifying slogan of the special group;

82 (iii) a symbol not exceeding two positions in size representing the special group; and

83 (iv) the combination of letters, numbers, or both uniquely identifying the registered
84 vehicle.

85 (3) (a) The division shall, after consultation with a representative designated by the
86 special group, specify the word or words comprising the special group name and the symbol to
87 be displayed upon the special group license plates.

88 (b) Collegiate, veterans', children's issues, snowmobile, soil conservation, Boy Scouts
89 of America, spay and neuter, Boys and Girls Clubs of America, and wildlife license plates may

90 not be redesigned under this section more frequently than every five years.

91 (c) Veterans' license plates shall display one of the symbols representing the Army,
92 Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, or American Legion.

93 (4) Subject to Subsections (10) and (12), the division shall only issue special group
94 license plates to a person who is:

95 (a) a current member of the Legislature;

96 (b) a current member of the United States Congress;

97 (c) a survivor of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor;

98 (d) a former prisoner of war;

99 (e) a recipient of a Purple Heart, as provided in Section 41-1a-409;

100 (f) a current member of the National Guard;

101 (g) a person with a disability or the registered owner of a vehicle that an organization
102 uses primarily for the transportation of persons with disabilities that limit or impair the ability
103 to walk;

104 (h) a contributor to an institution's scholastic scholarship fund;

105 (i) a contributor to the Division of Wildlife Resources;

106 (j) a contributor to the Office of Veterans' Affairs;

107 (k) licensing a special interest vehicle;

108 (l) licensing a vintage vehicle;

109 (m) a licensed amateur radio operator;

110 (n) registering a farm truck;

111 (o) a currently employed, volunteer, or retired firefighter;

112 (p) a contributor to the Division of Parks and Recreation;

113 (q) a contributor to the Department of Agriculture and Food;

114 (r) a contributor to the Guardian Ad Litem Services Account and the Children's
115 Museum of Utah;

116 (s) a contributor to the Boy Scouts of America;

117 (t) an emergency medical technician;

118 (u) a contributor to spay and neuter programs through No More Homeless Pets in Utah;

119 (v) a current member of a search and rescue team; [or]

120 (w) licensing a vehicle powered by clean fuel and for which a current clean special fuel

121 certificate is maintained as provided in Section 59-13-304[-]; or

122 (x) a contributor to the Utah Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs, Inc.

123 (5) (a) A vehicle displaying a survivor of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor license
124 plate decal, a former prisoner of war license plate decal, or a Purple Heart license plate decal
125 shall be titled in the name of the veteran or the veteran and spouse.

126 (b) Upon the death of the veteran, the surviving spouse may, upon application to the
127 division, retain the special group license plate decal so long as the surviving spouse remains
128 unmarried.

129 (c) The division shall require the surviving spouse to make a sworn statement that the
130 surviving spouse is unmarried before renewing the registration under this section.

131 (6) (a) (i) In accordance with rules made under Subsection (12), the division shall issue
132 a person with a disability special group license plate, temporary removable windshield placard,
133 or a removable windshield placard to:

134 (A) a qualifying person with a disability; or

135 (B) an organization that uses a vehicle registered in the applicant's name primarily for
136 the transportation of persons with disabilities that limit or impair the ability to walk.

137 (ii) The division shall issue a person with a disability special group license plate or a
138 removable windshield placard to a person with a permanent disability.

139 (iii) The issuance of a person with a disability special group license plate does not
140 preclude the issuance to the same applicant of a removable windshield placard.

141 (iv) The division shall issue on request one additional placard to a person with a person
142 with a disability special group license plate, temporary removable windshield placard, or a
143 removable windshield placard.

144 (b) The temporary removable windshield placard or removable windshield placard
145 shall be hung from the front windshield rearview mirror when the vehicle is parked in a
146 parking space reserved for persons with disabilities so that it is visible from the front and rear
147 of the vehicle.

148 (7) (a) An applicant for original or renewal collegiate license plates must be a
149 contributor to the institution named in the application and present the original contribution
150 verification form or make a contribution to the division at the time of application.

151 (b) An institution with a special group license plate shall issue to a contributor a

152 verification form designed by the commission containing:

- 153 (i) the name of the contributor;
- 154 (ii) the institution to which a donation was made;
- 155 (iii) the date of the donation; and
- 156 (iv) an attestation that the donation was for a scholastic scholarship.

157 (c) The state auditor may audit each institution to verify that the moneys collected by
158 the institutions from contributors are used for scholastic scholarships.

159 (d) After an applicant has been issued collegiate license plates or renewal decals, the
160 commission shall charge the institution whose plate was issued, a fee determined in accordance
161 with Section 63-38-3.2 for management and administrative expenses incurred in issuing and
162 renewing the collegiate license plates.

163 (e) If the contribution is made at the time of application, the contribution shall be:

- 164 (i) collected by the division;
- 165 (ii) treated as a voluntary contribution for the named institution's scholastic scholarship
166 fund and not as a motor vehicle registration fee; and

167 (iii) deposited with the named institution, less actual production and administrative
168 costs associated with making and issuing collegiate license plates.

169 (8) (a) An applicant for original or renewal wildlife license plates must be a contributor
170 to the Division of Wildlife Resources.

171 (b) This contribution shall be:

- 172 (i) collected by the division;
- 173 (ii) treated as a voluntary contribution for the funding of wildlife activities and not as a
174 motor vehicle registration fee; and

175 (iii) deposited into the Wildlife Resources Account created in Section 23-14-13, less
176 actual production and administrative costs associated with making and issuing wildlife license
177 plates.

178 (9) The division shall issue Olympic special group license plates.

179 (10) (a) An organization that makes a significant contribution to the state may request
180 the commission to authorize special group license plates for the organization if the organization
181 collects a minimum of 500 applications with the fees required under Section 41-1a-1211.

182 (b) If the commission approves the request, the division shall design a license plate in

183 accordance with Subsections (2) and (3).

184 (c) If the commission rejects the request, the organization shall refund all fees to the
185 applicants.

186 (11) Any person who meets the criteria established under this part for issuance of
187 special group license plates may make application in the same manner provided in Sections
188 41-1a-410 and 41-1a-411 for personalized special group license plates.

189 (12) (a) The commission shall make rules in accordance with Title 63, Chapter 46a,
190 Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, to:

191 (i) establish qualifying criteria for persons to receive, renew, or surrender special group
192 license plates, a temporary removable windshield placard, or a removable windshield
193 placard;

194 (ii) establish the maximum number of numerals or characters for special group license
195 plates; and

196 (iii) require all temporary removable windshield placards and removable windshield
197 placards to include:

198 (A) an identification number;

199 (B) an expiration date not to exceed six months for a temporary removable windshield
200 placard and two years for a removable windshield placard; and

201 (C) the seal or other identifying mark of the division.

202 (b) The qualifying criteria under Subsection (12)(a) for a person with a disability
203 special group license plate, temporary removable windshield placard, or removable windshield
204 placard shall include a requirement that an initial application of a person with a disability be
205 accompanied by the certification of a licensed physician:

206 (i) that the applicant meets the definition of a person with a disability that limits or
207 impairs the ability to walk as defined in the federal Uniform System for Parking for Persons
208 with Disabilities, 23 C.F.R. Ch. 11, Subch. B, Pt. 1235.2 (1991); and

209 (ii) containing the period of time that the physician determines the applicant will have
210 the disability, not to exceed six months in the case of a temporary disability.

211 (13) (a) The division may issue original veterans' license plates.

212 (b) An applicant for original veterans' license plates must be at least a one-time
213 contributor to the Office of Veterans' Affairs.

214 (c) This contribution shall be:

214 (i) collected by the division;
215 (ii) treated as a voluntary contribution for the Office of Veterans' Affairs and not as a
216 motor vehicle registration fee; and
217 (iii) transferred to the Office of Veterans' Affairs at least monthly, less actual
218 production and administrative costs associated with making and issuing veterans' license plates.
219 (14) (a) The division may issue original snowmobile license plates if the Division of
220 Parks and Recreation provides a one-time contribution of at least \$9,000 to the division from
221 restricted revenue in the Off-Highway Vehicle Account in the General Fund to cover startup
222 materials and programming costs.
223 (b) An applicant for original snowmobile license plates must be a contributor to the
224 Division of Parks and Recreation.
225 (c) This contribution shall be:
226 (i) collected by the division;
227 (ii) treated as a voluntary contribution for the Division of Parks and Recreation for the
228 benefit of snowmobile programs and not as a motor vehicle registration fee; and
229 (iii) transferred to the Division of Parks and Recreation at least monthly, less actual
230 production and administrative costs associated with making and issuing snowmobile license
231 plates.
232 (15) (a) (i) The division may issue original soil conservation license plates if soil
233 conservation districts provide a one-time contribution of at least \$9,000 to the division to cover
234 startup materials and programming costs.
235 (ii) The contribution described in Subsection (15)(a)(i) may be from private funds
236 available to soil conservation districts.
237 (b) An applicant for original soil conservation license plates must be a contributor to
238 the Department of Agriculture and Food.
239 (c) This contribution shall be:
240 (i) collected by the division;
241 (ii) treated as a voluntary contribution for the Department of Agriculture and Food for
242 the benefit of soil conservation districts and not as a motor vehicle registration fee; and
243 (iii) transferred to the Department of Agriculture and Food at least monthly, less actual
244 production and administrative costs associated with making and issuing soil conservation

245 license plates.

246 (16) (a) (i) The division may issue original children's issues license plates if the Office
247 of the Guardian Ad Litem Director and the Children's Museum of Utah each provide a
248 one-time contribution of at least \$4,500 to the division to cover startup materials and
249 programming costs.

250 (ii) The contribution described in Subsection (16)(a)(i) from the Office of the Guardian
251 Ad Litem Director shall be from private funds not normally available to the Office of the
252 Guardian Ad Litem Director.

253 (b) An applicant for original or renewal children's issues license plates must be a
254 contributor to the Guardian Ad Litem Services Account and the Children's Museum of Utah.

255 (c) This contribution shall be:

256 (i) collected by the division;

257 (ii) treated as a voluntary contribution for the Guardian Ad Litem Services Account
258 and the Children's Museum of Utah and not as a motor vehicle registration fee; and

259 (iii) transferred to the Guardian Ad Litem Services Account and the Children's
260 Museum of Utah at least monthly, less actual production and administrative costs associated
261 with making and issuing children's issues license plates.

262 (17) A current member of the Legislature may select the Olympic license plate as the
263 legislator's special group license plate. The legislator shall pay the special fees for the Olympic
264 license plate, as provided in Section 41-1a-417 and Subsection 41-1a-1211(12).

265 (18) (a) Beginning January 1, 2001, the division may issue original Boy Scouts of
266 America license plates if the Boy Scouts of America provides a one-time contribution of at
267 least \$9,000 to the division to cover startup materials and programming costs.

268 (b) An applicant for original or renewal Boy Scouts of America license plates must be
269 a contributor to the Boy Scouts of America.

270 (c) This contribution shall be:

271 (i) collected by the division;

272 (ii) treated as a voluntary contribution for the Boy Scouts of America and not as a
273 motor vehicle registration fee; and

274 (iii) transferred to the Boy Scouts of America at least monthly, less actual production
275 and administrative costs associated with making and issuing Boy Scouts of America license

276 plates.

277 (19) (a) Beginning January 1, 2002, the division may issue original spay and neuter
278 license plates if No More Homeless Pets in Utah provides a one-time contribution of at least
279 \$9,000 to the division to cover startup materials and programming costs.

280 (b) An applicant for original or renewal spay and neuter license plates must be a
281 contributor to spay and neuter programs.

282 (c) This contribution shall be:

283 (i) collected by the division;

284 (ii) treated as a voluntary contribution to No More Homeless Pets in Utah for spay and
285 neuter programs and not as a motor vehicle registration fee; and

286 (iii) transferred to No More Homeless Pets in Utah at least monthly, less actual
287 production and administrative costs associated with making and issuing spay and neuter license
288 plates.

289 (20) (a) Beginning October 1, 2003, the division may issue original Boys and Girls
290 Clubs of America license plates if prior to October 1, 2003 the Utah Alliance of Boys and Girls
291 Clubs, Inc. provides a one-time contribution of at least \$6,000 to the division to cover startup
292 materials and programming costs.

293 (b) An applicant for original or renewal Boys and Girls Clubs of America license plates
294 must be a contributor to Utah Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs, Inc.

295 (c) This contribution shall be:

296 (i) collected by the division;

297 (ii) treated as a voluntary contribution to the Utah Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs,
298 Inc. to provide and enhance youth development programs and not as a motor vehicle
299 registration fee; and

300 (iii) transferred to the Utah Alliance of Boys and Girls Clubs, Inc. at least monthly, less
301 actual production and administrative costs associated with making and issuing the Boys and
302 Girls Clubs of America license plates.

303 Section 2. Section **41-1a-1201** is amended to read:

304 **41-1a-1201. Disposition of fees.**

305 (1) All fees received and collected under this part shall be transmitted daily to the state
306 treasurer.

307 (2) Except as provided in Subsections (3), (4), and (6), and Subsections 41-1a-408(7),
308 (8), (13), (14), (15), (16), (18), [~~and~~] (19), and (20), and in Section 41-1a-1220, all fees
309 collected under this part shall be deposited in the Transportation Fund.

310 (3) (a) Funds generated under Subsections 41-1a-1211(1)(a), (7)(a), and (8) and
311 Section 41-1a-1212 may be used by the commission as a dedicated credit to cover the costs
312 incurred in issuing license plates under Part 4, License Plates and Registration Indicia.

313 (b) Funds collected under Subsections 41-1a-1211(3), (5)(b), and (5)(c), less the actual
314 cost incurred by the division in purchasing decals for special group license plates, shall be
315 deposited in the Transportation Fund.

316 (c) Fees for statehood centennial license plates shall be collected and deposited in the
317 Transportation Fund, less production and administrative costs incurred by the commission.

318 (d) Fees for Olympic special group license plates shall be collected and deposited as
319 provided under Section 41-1a-417.

320 (4) All funds available to the commission for purchase and distribution of license
321 plates and decals are nonlapsing.

322 (5) Except as provided in Subsection (3) and Section 41-1a-1205, the expenses of the
323 commission in enforcing and administering this part shall be provided for by legislative
324 appropriation from the revenues of the Transportation Fund.

325 (6) The following portions of the registration fees imposed under Section 41-1a-1206
326 for each vehicle shall be deposited in the Centennial Highway Fund created under Section
327 72-2-118:

328 (a) \$10 of the registration fees imposed under Subsections 41-1a-1206(1)(a), (1)(b),
329 (2), and (5);

330 (b) \$1 of the registration fees imposed under Subsections 41-1a-1206(1)(c)(i),
331 (1)(c)(ii), and (1)(d)(ii);

332 (c) \$2 of the registration fee imposed under Subsection 41-1a-1206(1)(e)(ii);

333 (d) \$3 of the registration fee imposed under Subsection 41-1a-1206(1)(d)(i); and

334 (e) \$4.50 of the registration fee imposed under Subsection 41-1a-1206(1)(e)(i).

335 Section 3. Section **41-1a-1211** is amended to read:

336 **41-1a-1211. License plate fees -- Application fees for issuance and renewal of**
337 **personalized and special group license plates -- Replacement fee for license plates --**

338 **Postage fees.**

339 (1) A license plate fee of \$5 per set shall be paid to the division for the issuance of any
340 new license plate under Part 4, License Plates and Registration Indicia, except for license plates
341 issued under Sections 41-1a-407 and 41-1a-417. The license plate fee shall be deposited as
342 follows:

343 (a) \$4 as provided in Section 41-1a-1201; and

344 (b) \$1 in the Transportation Fund.

345 (2) An applicant for original issuance of personalized license plates issued under
346 Section 41-1a-410 shall pay a \$50 per set license plate application fee in addition to the fee
347 required in Subsection (1).

348 (3) (a) Except as provided in Subsections (3)(b) and (3)(c), applicants for original
349 issuance of special group license plates issued under Section 41-1a-408 shall pay a \$50 per set
350 license plate application fee in addition to the fee required under Subsection (1).

351 (b) A person who qualifies for a licensed amateur radio operator or search and rescue
352 team special group license plate shall pay a \$5 fee for the original set of license plates in
353 addition to the fee required under Subsection (1).

354 (c) A person who qualifies for legislative, United States Congressional, person with a
355 disability, collegiate, veterans', wildlife, National Guard, Purple Heart, Prisoner of War,
356 Survivor of the Japanese Attack on Pearl Harbor, firefighter, children's issues, snowmobile, soil
357 conservation, Boy Scouts of America, spay and neuter, farm vehicle, emergency medical
358 technician, ~~or~~ clean fuel, or Boys and Girls Clubs of America special group license plates is
359 exempt from payment of special group license plate application fees imposed under this
360 Subsection (3).

361 (4) An applicant for original issuance of personalized special group license plates shall
362 pay the license plate application fees required in Subsection (2) in addition to the license plate
363 fees and license plate application fees established under Subsections (1) and (3).

364 (5) The following application fees for renewal of personalized and special group
365 license plates shall be paid to the division at the time of renewal of registration:

366 (a) an applicant for renewal of personalized license plates issued under Section
367 41-1a-410 shall pay a \$10 per set application fee;

368 (b) except as provided in Subsection (5)(c), an applicant for renewal of special group

369 license plates issued under Section 41-1a-408 shall pay a \$10 per set application fee; and

370 (c) an applicant for renewal of legislative, United States Congressional, person with a
371 disability, collegiate, wildlife, National Guard, Purple Heart, Prisoner of War, Survivor of the
372 Japanese Attack on Pearl Harbor, farm vehicle, vintage vehicle, firefighter, children's issues,
373 snowmobile, soil conservation, Boy Scouts of America, spay and neuter, emergency medical
374 technician, search and rescue team, clean fuel, [or] licensed amateur radio operator, or Boys
375 and Girls Clubs of America special group license plates is exempt from payment of application
376 fees imposed under Subsection (5)(b).

377 (6) An applicant for renewal of personalized special group license plates shall pay the
378 application fee required in Subsection (5)(a) in addition to the applicable application fees for
379 renewal of license plates established under Subsections (5)(b) and (5)(c).

380 (7) A fee of \$5 shall be paid to the division for the replacement of any license plate
381 issued under Part 4, License Plates and Registration Indicia. The license plate fee shall be
382 deposited as follows:

383 (a) \$4 as provided in Section 41-1a-1201; and

384 (b) \$1 in the Transportation Fund.

385 (8) The division may charge a fee established under Section 63-38-3.2 to recover its
386 costs for the replacement of decals issued under Section 41-1a-408.

387 (9) The division may charge a fee established under Section 63-38-3.2 to recover the
388 cost of issuing stickers under Section 41-1a-416.

389 (10) In addition to any other fees required by this section, the division shall assess a fee
390 established under Section 63-38-3.2 to cover postage expenses if new or replacement license
391 plates are mailed to the applicant.

392 (11) The fees required under this section are separate from and in addition to
393 registration fees required under Section 41-1a-1206.

394 (12) For vehicles with registration years expiring on or before June 30, 2002,
395 applicants for original Olympic special group license plates or renewal of registration with
396 Olympic special group license plates shall pay the fees required under Section 41-1a-417.

397 **Section 4. Effective date.**

398 This act takes effect on October 1, 2003.

399 **Section 5. Coordination clause.**

400 If this bill and H.B. 7, Special Group License Plate Revisions, both pass, it is the intent
401 of the Legislature that the provisions of H.B. 7 supercede the provisions of this bill except that:

402 (1) Subsection 41-1a-418(1)(e) of H.B. 7 be amended to include a new subsection as
403 follows:

404 "(ix) the Boys and Girls Clubs of America"; and
