5 **This act modifies the Juvenile Court Act, providing that a person ordered to obtain**
6 **counseling by the court may be counseled by a member of the clergy.**

9 **78-3a-122**, Utah Code Annotated 1953

10 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

11 Section 1. Section **78-3a-122** is enacted to read:

12 **78-3a-122. Court-ordered counseling.**

13 If a person is ordered by the court to participate in counseling as part of a program or
14 treatment plan, the person may be counseled by a member of the clergy, subject to reporting
15 requirements prescribed within the program or plan.
