18	(1) A clause in a construction contract which purports to waive, release, limit, or
19	extinguish the rights of an owner, contractor, subcontractor, or supplier to damages or an
20	equitable adjustment arising out of an unreasonable delay in performance caused by an act or
21	omission of another party to the contract, or a person acting for that party is against public
22	policy and is void and unenforceable.
23	(2) This section may not be construed to:
24	(a) void any provision in a construction contract which requires notification of delay;
25	(b) void any provision in a construction contract which provides for arbitration or other
26	procedure for dispute resolution; or
27	(c) limit the rights of a party to the construction contract to assert the defense of
