31	(1) (a) There is created within the division the Construction Services Commission.
32	(b) The commission shall:
33	[(a)] (i) with the concurrence of the director, make reasonable rules under Title 63,
34	Chapter 46a, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, to administer and enforce this chapter
35	which are consistent with this chapter including:
36	[(i)] (A) licensing of various licensees;
37	[(ii)] (B) examination requirements and administration of the examinations, to include
