RENEWAL OF FISHING LICENSE

LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill amends fishing licensing provisions to allow for licenses that are issued for 365 days from the date of sale.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ amends fishing licensing provisions to allow for licenses to be issued for 365 days from the date of sale; and
- ▶ allows persons under 14 years of age to fish without a license pursuant to rules, proclamations, and orders set forth by the Wildlife Board.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **23-19-7** is amended to read:

23-19-7. Licenses issuance -- Expiration date.

The licenses [~~required by~~] issued under this chapter, except lifetime licenses, [shall be issued annually and shall expire on December 31st each year.] will expire 365 days from the date of issue.

Section 2. Section **23-19-21** is amended to read:

23-19-21. Fishing license -- Limited number of days.

(1) A person 14 years of age or older shall purchase a fishing license before engaging in any regulated fishing activity.

~~(1)~~ (2) A person 14 years of age or older, upon paying the fee prescribed by the Wildlife Board, may receive a license to fish:

(a) for one day; ~~[or]~~

(b) for seven consecutive days~~[-];~~ or

(c) for 365 consecutive days from the date of sale.

(3) A person under 14 years of age may fish without a license pursuant to rules, proclamations, and orders set forth by the Wildlife Board.

~~(2)~~ (4) The effective date shall be indicated on the license.

Section 3. Repealer.

This bill repeals:

Section **23-19-18, Fishing license -- Season.**

Section 4. Effective date.

This bill takes effect on December 1, 2005.
