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7 **LONG TITLE**

8 **General Description:**

9 This bill encourages each school district to hold a public hearing regarding health,
10 nutrition, and physical education and requires revenue reporting by the schools.

11 **Highlighted Provisions:**

12 This bill:

- 13 ▶ encourages each school district to hold a public hearing regarding health, nutrition,
14 and physical education;
15 ▶ requires public schools to report revenues received by the school from designated
16 sources; and
17 ▶ requires school districts to maintain the revenue reports as public records.

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Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **53A-3-426** is enacted to read:

53A-3-426. Elementary school health, nutrition, and physical education -- Local policy.

(1) It is the intent of the Legislature to urge elementary schools to provide health, nutrition, and physical education that encourages students to develop the knowledge, attitude, skills, and behaviors to adopt and maintain healthy eating habits and physically active lifestyles. The Legislature recognizes that good nutrition and adequate physical activity help children grow, develop, and do well in school.

(2) (a) Each local school board may hold a public meeting regarding health, nutrition, and physical education in the public schools.

(b) Each school board may set policies regarding health, nutrition, and physical education.

Section 2. Section **53A-3-427** is enacted to read:

53A-3-427. Public School Revenue Reports.

(1) Beginning July 1, 2005, each public school shall annually:

(a) account for money received by the school from all revenues collected by the school including vending machine sales, fund raising, gate receipts, building rental fees, and donations; and

(b) report to the local school board:

(i) all revenues received by the school during the annual period, itemized by the source of the revenue;

(ii) report on the quantity and types of products and services sold; and

(iii) the use of the money by the school.

(2) The local school board shall maintain the annual report required by Subsection (1) as a public document under Title 63, Chapter 2, Government Records Access and Management Act.
