Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **58-42a-302** is amended to read:

58-42a-302. Qualifications for licensure.

- (1) All applicants for licensure as an occupational therapist shall:
- (a) submit an application in a form as prescribed by the division;
- (b) pay a fee as determined by the department under Section 63-38-3.2;
- (c) be of good moral character as it relates to the functions and responsibilities of the

practice of occupational therapy;

(d) graduate with a bachelors or [masters] graduate degree in occupational therapy from a program accredited by the [American] Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy [Association] Education; and

- (e) be certified by the [American] National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy [Certification Board] as an occupational therapist registered.
 - (2) All applicants for licensure as an occupational therapist assistant shall:
 - (a) submit an application in a form as prescribed by the division;
 - (b) pay a fee as determined by the department under Section 63-38-3.2;
- (c) be of good moral character as it relates to the functions and responsibilities of the practice of occupational therapy;
- (d) graduate with a two-year associate degree in occupational therapy from a program accredited by the [American] Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy [Certification Board] Education; and
- (e) be certified by the [American] National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy [Certification Board] as a certified occupational therapist assistant.
