Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section 58-17a-305 is amended to read:
58-17a-305. Exemptions from licensure.
In addition to the exemptions from licensure in Section 58-1-307:

28	(1) an individual who has completed all qualifications for licensure as a pharmacy
29	technician, except an experience requirement which may be established by rule under
30	Subsection 58-17a-302(4), may practice under the direct personal supervision of a pharmacist
31	while completing that requirement for a period not to exceed six consecutive months without
