29	Section 1. Section <b>53A-1-708</b> is enacted to read:
30	53A-1-708. Grants for electronic test administration and scoring.
31	(1) As used in this section:
32	(a) "summative tests" means tests administered near the end of a course to assess
33	overall achievement of course goals; and
34	(b) "U-PASS" means the Utah Performance Assessment System for Students.
35	(2) The State Board of Education may award grants to school districts and charter
36	schools for the electronic administration and scoring of summative tests required under
37	U-PASS to enable parents of students and school staff to review the test scores by the end of
38	the school year.
39	(3) (a) Grant monies may be used to pay for any of the following, provided it is directly
40	related to the electronic administration and scoring of summative tests required under U-PASS:
41	(i) contracted testing services;
42	(ii) computer equipment and peripherals, including electronic data capture devices

44	(iii) software;

(2) The appropriation in Subsection (1) shall be nonlapsing.
