This bill modifies provisions relating to county classifications.

AMENDS:

17-50-501, as enacted by Chapter 318, Laws of Utah 2000

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **17-50-501** is amended to read:

17-50-501. Classification of counties.

(1) Each county shall be classified according to its population.

(2) (a) A county with a population of 700,000 or more is a county of the first class.

(b) A county with a population of [~~125,000~~] 150,000 or more but less than 700,000 is a county of the second class.



28 (c) A county with a population of [~~18,000~~] 31,000 or more but less than [~~125,000~~]
29 150,000 is a county of the third class.

30 (d) A county with a population of [~~10,000~~] 11,000 or more but less than [~~18,000~~]
31 31,000 is a county of the fourth class.

32 (e) A county with a population of [~~3,500~~] 4,000 or more but less than [~~10,000~~] 11,000
33 is a county of the fifth class.

34 (f) A county with a population less than [~~3,500~~] 4,000 is a county of the sixth class.
