► allows 11-year-old persons to obtain a combination license to hunt small game and
fish if their 12th birthday falls within the calendar year for which the license is
issued;
 allows 11-year-old persons to obtain a cougar or bear hunting permit if their 12th
birthday falls within the calendar year for which the hunting permit is issued;
 allows 11-year-old persons to obtain a small game hunting license if their 12th
birthday falls within the calendar year for which the license is issued;
▶ allows a person 12 years of age or older, and in certain circumstances, 11-year-old
persons, to obtain a turkey hunting permit; and
provides that \$1 of each resident's turkey hunting fee be used for the hunters
education program.
