## **State Impact**

The bill imposes a \$32 security surcharge on criminal convictions and moving violations in justice courts. It is estimated that the surcharge will increase state revenues by \$2,700,000 annually beginning FY 2005. The bill appropriates to the Administrative Office of the Courts: one time FY 2005 funds of \$1,800,000 from the Court Security Account; and one time FY 2005 funds of \$900,000 from the newly created Justice Court Technology, Security, and Training Account.
