General Description:						
This bill appropriates state funds to increase the state's premium subsidy for the						
Covered-At-Work Program and directs the Department of Health to seek an amendment						
to the state's Primary Care Network waiver granted by the federal government.						
Highlighted Provisions:						
This bill:						
<ul> <li>provides for an increase in the premium subsidy amount for persons eligible for the</li> </ul>						
Covered-At-Work Program by \$15 per month for a maximum of 2,000 qualifying						
persons; and						
<ul> <li>directs the Utah Department of Health to seek an amendment to the 1115 Primary</li> </ul>						
Care Network Waiver's premium subsidy component, also known as						
Covered-At-Work that would do the following:						
• increase the five-year individual monthly premium subsidy amount, currently						
consisting of varying amounts per year, to \$85 per year;						
• increase the five-year individual and spouse monthly premium amount,						
currently consisting of varying amounts per year, to \$170; and						
• reduce the number of federally authorized eligible positions under the premium						
subsidy component of the waiver from 6,000 to 2,000.

38	Section 1. Section <b>26-18-3.5</b> is amended to read:						
39	26-18-3.5. Copayments by health service recipients, spouses, and parents.						
40	(1) The department shall selectively provide for enrollment fees, premiums,						
41	deductions, cost sharing or other similar charges to be paid by recipients, their spouses, and						
42	parents, within the limitations of federal law and regulation.						
43	(2) (a) The department shall seek approval under the department's Section 1115						
44	Medicaid waiver to cap enrollment fees for the Primary Care Network Demonstration Project						
45	in accordance with Subsection (2)(b).						
46	(b) Pursuant to a waiver obtained under Subsection (2)(a), the department shall cap						
47	enrollment fees for the primary care network at \$15 per year for those persons who, after July						
48	1, 2003, are eligible to begin receiving General Assistance under Section 35A-3-401.						
49	(c) Beginning July 1, 2004, and pursuant to a waiver obtained under Subsection (2)(a),						
50	the department shall cap enrollment fees for the primary care network at \$25 per year for those						
51	persons who have an income level that is below 50% of the federal poverty level.						
52	(3) Beginning July 1, 2005:						
53	(a) the state's portion of the 1115 Primary Care Network Waiver's Premium subsidy						
54	component, also known as Covered-At-Work, shall be \$65 per month; and						
55	(b) the state shall provide premium subsidies under Subsection (3)(a) for 2,000 eligible

57	Section 2. Direction to Department of Health regarding Covered-At-Work.						
58	(1) The Department of Health shall seek an amendment to the 1115 Primary Care						

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59	Network Waiver's premium subsidy component, also known as Covered-At-Work, to
60	accomplish the following:
61	(a) increase the five-year individual monthly premium subsidy amount to \$85 per
62	month;
63	(b) increase the five-year individual and spouse monthly premium amount to \$170 per
64	month; and
65	(c) reduce the number of federally authorized slots under the 1115 Primary Care
66	Network Waiver's premium subsidy component to 2,000 slots.
67	(2) The increases in the premium subsidy amounts referred to in Subsection (1) are
68	subject to federal approval.
69	Section 3. Appropriation.
70	As an ongoing appropriation, subject to future budget constraints, there is appropriated
71	from the General Fund for fiscal year 2005-06, \$360,000 to the Department of Health to fund
72	the increase in the state's portion of the 1115 Primary Care Network Waiver's Premium subsidy
73	component, also known as Covered-At-Work referred to in Subsection 26-18-3.5(3).
74	Section 4. Effective date.
75	This bill takes effect on July 1, 2005.
