 replaces the term "majority report" with "committee report";
 outlines the process for being listed as dissenting from a committee report; and
 details what is read in and listed on the journal from the minority report.

28	HR-24.16. Voting Chair to Verbally Announce the Vote Dissenting Members
29	to be Reported.
30	(1) After the committee votes, the chair shall:
31	(a) determine whether the motion passed or failed;
32	(b) verbally announce that the motion passed or that the motion failed; and
33	(c) verbally identify by name either the committee members who voted "yes" or the
34	committee members who voted "no."
35	(2) (a) Members dissenting from a committee report may file a minority report or may
36	be listed on the [majority] committee report as dissenting.
37	(b) If any member of the committee desires to file a minority report or be listed on the
38	committee report as dissenting, that committee member shall advise the committee during the

45	the committee report as dissenting, staff for that committee shall prepare the committee report
46	with any dissenting committee member listed separately by name.

49	(1) The Chief Clerk of the House or his designee shall read the committee report to the
50	House and this constitutes the second reading of any bill referred to in the report. Each bill
51	listed shall be read by title, unless the House suspends this requirement by a two-thirds vote.
52	(cf. HR-27.16)
53	(2) The Reading Clerk shall read the committee report.
54	(3) A motion to adopt a "favorable" committee report places the bill before the House
55	with all committee amendments. If a motion to adopt a "favorable" committee report does not
56	receive a majority vote, the bill shall be returned to the House Rules Committee.
57	(4) A majority vote of the members present is required to pass the bill on the second
58	reading calendar.
