	Section 1. <b>HR-24.16</b> is amended to read:



26	HR-24.16. Voting Chair to Verbally Announce the Vote Dissenting Members

28	(1) After the committee votes, the chair shall:
29	(a) determine whether the motion passed or failed;
30	(b) verbally announce that the motion passed or that the motion failed; and
31	(c) verbally identify by name either the committee members who voted "yes" or the

33	(2) (a) Members dissenting from a committee report may file a minority report or may
