General Description:

This joint resolution of the Legislature recognizes the centennial of the Granite School District.

Highlighted Provisions:

This resolution:

- ▶ recognizes the Granite School District's Centennial and the great work that has been done by students, teachers, administrators and support staff of the district's schools and parents during the past 100 years in the Granite School District; and
- ▶ urges students, teachers, administrators, support staff, parents, and other citizens to become acquainted with Granite School District's heritage and to participate in events held during the year to recognize the centennial.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

WHEREAS, on December 15, 1904, the Board of Salt Lake County Commissioners signed documents that created the Granite and Jordan School Districts;

WHEREAS, from that time forward scores of citizens have given of their time as

elected members of the Granite School District Board of Education;

WHEREAS, since 1904, 15 Granite District superintendents have prepared an executive educational system for a large share of the state's children, turning none away;

WHEREAS, educators throughout the century have faced the challenges of change as farming communities developed into today's technology-driven global community;

WHEREAS, thousands of dedicated teachers, administrators, and support staff have worked diligently to insure that all children develop basic skills, thinking abilities, and strong characters;

WHEREAS, for 100 years Granite schools and educators have prepared diverse students from all classes and backgrounds to participate in the greatness of American society; and

WHEREAS, December 15, 2004, marked the centennial milestone of Granite School District's history:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah recognizes the Granite School District's Centennial and the great work that has been done by students, teachers, the administrators and support staff of the district's schools, and parents during the past 100 years in the Granite School District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature urges students, teachers, administrators, support staff, parents, and other citizens to become acquainted with Granite School District's heritage and to participate in events held during the year as part of recognizing the centennial.
