H.B. 159 Motor Assisted Scooter and Mini-motorcycle Amendments (Rep. B. Dee)

Rep. Dee introduced H.B. 159 and explained it to the committee.

MOTION: Rep. Hardy moved to amend the bill as follows:

- 1. Page 4, Lines 112 through 118:
 - 112 (21) (a) "Mini-motorcycle" means a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle that has a seat
 - saddle that is less than 24 inches from the ground as measured on a level surface with properly
 - inflated tires.
 - (b) "Mini-motorcycle" does not include a moped or a motor assisted scooter.
 - (c) "Mini-motorcycle" does not include a motorcycle that is:
 - (i) legally licensed and registered for highway use;
 - $\{\frac{\text{(i)}}{\text{(ii)}}\}$ designed for off-highway use; and
 - 118 {-(ii)} (iii) registered as an off-highway vehicle under Section 41-22-3.

- 112 (21) (a) "Mini-motorcycle" means a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle that has a seat or
- saddle that is less than 24 inches from the ground as measured on a level surface with properly
- inflated tires.
- (b) "Mini-motorcycle" does not include a moped or a motor assisted scooter.
- (c) "Mini-motorcycle" does not include a motorcycle that is:
 - (i) legally licensed and registered for highway use; or
- 117 {<u>(ii)</u>} <u>(ii) (A)</u> <u>designed for off-highway use; and</u>
- 118 { (ii) } (B) registered as an off-highway vehicle under Section 41-22-3.

The motion to amend the bill passed unanimously.

MOTION: Rep. Hardy moved to further amend the bill as follows:

1. Page 9, Lines 270 through 271:

- 270 (e) carrying more persons at one time than the number for which it is designed {= except
- 271 <u>an adult operator may carry a child securely attached to the operator in a pack or sling</u> } ; or
