Section 1. Section 26-18-3.2 is enacted to read:		
26-18-3.2. Dental and physician services Medicaid program.		
(1) The purpose of this section is to:		
(a) increase the number of dentists that will be able to financially support dental		
services to children in the Medicaid program and increase access to dental services for children		
on Medicaid; and		
(b) increase the number of physicians that will be able to financially support medical
