State Impact

This bill appropriates \$3,000,000 in ongoing Uniform School Fund revenue to the State Board of Education to implement the Teacher Mentoring Program outlined in the bill. Further, bill provisions appropriate \$18,000,000 in ongoing Uniform School Fund revenue to the State Board of Education to fund the Beginning Teacher Compensation Program outlined in the bill. Administration of these two programs can be handled within existing budget allocations.
