	(1) As used in this section:					
	(a) "full-day kindergarten" means a kindergarten program that provides at least the					
	same number of instructional hours per school year as a nonkindergarten grade, as defined					
	under State Board of Education rule; and					
	(b) "school" means a public school, including a charter school.					
	(2) (a) If funds are appropriated for this purpose, the State Board of Education shall					
	allocate available funds to schools that apply to offer full-day kindergarten.
