27	(1) (a) The board shall consist of 18 residents of the state.
28	(b) [(i)] Fifteen members shall be appointed by the governor with the consent of the

- [(10)] (12) A quorum of the voting members of the board is required to conduct its business and consists of nine members.
- [(11)] (13) (a) A vacancy in the board occurring before the expiration of a voting member's full term shall be immediately filled by appointment by the governor with the consent of the Senate.
  - (b) The appointee serves for the remainder of the unexpired term.
- [(12)] (14) (a) Each member of the board shall receive a per diem as provided by law as compensation for services for attending meetings of the board.
- (b) Each member shall also be paid actual expenses incurred for attending meetings of the board or its committees or for attending to any business of the institutions under the direction of the board or authority of the board or its committees.
