	(1) The division shall:

	this chapter;

169	53B-3-102 or a private institution of higher education in the state accredited by a regional or				
170	national accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education.				
171	(2) (a) An applicant for original or renewal collegiate special group license plates under				
172	Subsection (1)(a)(i) must be a contributor to the institution named in the application and				
173	present the original contribution verification form under Subsection (2)(b) or make a				
174	contribution to the division at the time of application under Subsection (3).				
175	(b) An institution with a support special group license plate shall issue to a contributor

186	renewing the collegiate license plates.
187	(e) If the contribution is made at the time of application, the contribution shall be
188	collected, treated, and deposited as provided under Subsection (3).
189	(3) (a) An applicant for original or renewal support special group license plates under
190	this section must be a contributor to the sponsoring organization associated with the license
191	plate.
192	(b) This contribution shall be:
193	(i) unless collected by the named institution under Subsection (2), collected by the
194	division;
195	(ii) considered a voluntary contribution for the funding of the activities specified under
196	this section and not a motor vehicle registration fee; and
197	(iii) deposited into the appropriate account less actual administrative costs associated

State Impact

Start-up costs and revenue will vary depending on the volume of license plates and the number of colors ordered for the sticker. This fiscal note shows an estimate of \$6,200 based on a three color sticker and 250 sets of plates issued.

Individual and Business Impact

There is a \$5 per plate new plate fee and the individual must pay a \$25 per year annual contribution to Native American scholarships. The amount shown in this note is an estimate based on selling 250 plates. Actual revenue will vary according to the number of licenses sold.
