## **State Impact**

A general obligation bond of \$1.3 billion will be issued for Highway 6 (plus issuance costs). Assuming a standard fifteen-year repayment period with flattened payments at today's interest rates, there will be fifteen annual payments of approximately \$114 million each. The actual debt service schedule will vary according to how the bond is structured. With the passage of this bill, the state will be in close proximity to the constituional debt limit.
