Section 1. Section 13-42-101 is enacted to read:

29	Part 1. General Provisions
30	<u>13-42-101.</u> Title.
31	This chapter is known as the "Point-of-Sale Device Act."
32	Section 2. Section 13-42-102 is enacted to read:
33	<u>13-42-102.</u> Definitions.
34	As used in this chapter:
35	(1) "Automated teller machine" is as defined in Section 7-16a-102.
36	(2) "Customer" means a user of a point-of-sale device.
37	(3) "Operator" means a person who owns or who contracts with an owner of a
38	point-of-sale device to operate the point-of-sale device.
39	(4) (a) Except as provided in Subsection (4)(b), "point-of-sale device" means a device
40	used by a customer for the purchase of a good or service if the customer's personal
41	identification number is required for use of the device.

44	(ii) a point-of-sale device that is designed to service or exclusively services a motor

46	Section 3. Section 13-42-201 is enacted to read:
47	Part 2. Requirements for Point-of-Sale Device
48	13-42-201. Requirements of an operator of a point-of-sale device.
49	(1) (a) In accordance with this section, an operator of a point-of-sale device at a retail
50	establishment that has a video touch screen or other nontactile keypad shall ensure that the
51	point-of-sale device is also equipped with:
52	(i) a keypad that:
53	(A) is a tactually discernible keypad similar to a telephone keypad;
54	(B) enables a visually impaired customer to enter:
55	(I) the customer's own personal identification number; or
56	(II) other personal information necessary to process the transaction;
57	(C) provides the opportunity for the same degree of privacy input and output available
58	to all individuals; and

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59	(D) contains a raised dot on the number 5 key that has:
60	(I) a dot base diameter between 1.5 millimeters and 1.6 millimeters; and
61	(II) a height between 0.6 millimeters and 0.9 millimeters; or
62	(ii) other technology that enables a visually impaired customer:
63	(A) to access the video touch screen device with the customer's personal identifier; and
64	(B) to process the customer's transaction in a manner that provides the opportunity for
65	the same degree of privacy input and output available to all individuals.
66	(b) Notwithstanding Subsection (1)(a), if a physical location of a retail establishment
67	has two or more point-of-sale devices operated by the same operator, only 50% of the
68	point-of-sale devices are required to be equipped as provided in Subsection (1).
69	(c) (i) A point-of-sale device does not comply with this section unless it includes a
70	device, whether internal or external to the point-of-sale device, that:
71	(A) does not lend itself to easy removal;
72	(B) allows visually impaired users easy access; and
73	(C) otherwise meets the terms and conditions of this section.
74	(ii) If the point-of-sale device is free standing, the tactile keyboard or other technology
75	shall be permanently attached to the point-of-sale device by means of a braided wire or some
76	other tether.
77	(2) The operator described in Subsection (1) shall comply with the requirements of
78	Subsection (1) by the sooner of:
79	(a) after July 1, 2006, the day on which the point-of-sale device is changed to include a
80	video touch screen or other nontactile keypad; or
81	(b) July 1, 2007.
82	(3) This section does preclude or limit any other existing right or remedy as it pertains
83	to point-of-sale devices and accessibility.
84	Section 4. Effective date.
85	This bill takes effect on July 1, 2006.
