8	General Description:
9	This bill modifies the State System of Public Education Code by establishing a Grades
10	4 - 6 Mathematics Improvement Program.

Utah Code Sections Affected:
ENACTS: 53A-17a-152, Utah Code Annotated 1953
Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section <b>53A-17a-152</b> is enacted to read:
53A-17a-152. Grades 4 - 6 Mathematics Improvement.
(1) As used in this section:
(a) "program" means the Grades 4 - 6 Mathematics Improvement Program; and
(b) "program monies" means monies appropriated by the Legislature to the program.
(2) The Grades 4 - 6 Mathematics Improvement Program consists of program monies
and is established to achieve the state's goal of having students proficient in mathematics by the
end of elementary school.
(3) Subject to future budget constraints, the Legislature may annually appropriate
money to the program.
(4) (a) A school district or charter school shall submit a plan to the State Board of
Education for mathematics proficiency improvement that incorporates the following
components:
(i) assessment;
(ii) intervention strategies; and
(iii) professional development to build mathematics content knowledge for all fourth,
fifth, and sixth grade teachers of mathematics.
(b) The State Board of Education shall provide model plans that a school district or
charter school may use, or the district or school may develop its own plan.
(c) Plans developed by a school district or charter school shall be approved by the State
Board of Education before program monies may be used by the school district or charter
school.
(5) Program monies shall be allocated to districts and charter schools based upon the
following components:
(a) the number of fourth, fifth, and sixth grade teachers in each district or charter
school; and

57	(b) each school district's or charter school's prior fall enrollment of fourth, fifth, and
58	sixth grade students.
59	(6) (a) Each school district and charter school shall use program monies for
60	mathematics proficiency improvement in grades four, five, and six.
61	(b) Program monies may not be used to supplant funds for existing programs, but may
62	be used to augment existing programs.
63	(7) (a) Each school district and charter school shall annually submit a report to the
64	State Board of Education accounting for the expenditure of program monies in accordance with
65	its plan for mathematics proficiency improvement.
66	(b) If a school district or charter school uses program monies in a manner that is
67	inconsistent with Subsection (6), the school district or charter school is liable for reimbursing
68	the State Board of Education for the amount of program monies improperly used, up to the
69	amount of program monies received from the State Board of Education.
70	(8) In accordance with Title 63, Chapter 46a, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, the
71	State Board of Education shall make rules:
72	(a) implementing the program; and
73	(b) requiring each school district or charter school to annually report progress in
74	meeting goals stated in the district's or charter school's plan for mathematics improvement.
75	(9) (a) If a school district or charter school does not meet or exceed its goals, the school
76	district or charter school shall prepare a new plan which corrects deficiencies.
77	(b) The new plan shall be approved by the State Board of Education before the school
78	district or charter school receives an allocation for the next year.
79	Section 2. Appropriation.
80	There is appropriated from the Uniform School Fund for fiscal year 2006-07 only,
81	\$15,000,000 to the State Board of Education to fund the Grades 4 - 6 Mathematics
82	Improvement Program.
