General Description:

This bill establishes that documents may be self authenticated by affixing one's signature to the document under penalty of perjury.

46-5-1, Utah Code Annotated 1953

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **46-5-1** is enacted to read:

46-5-1. Self-authentication of documents.

If the law requires or permits ~~§→ [a sworn statement,] an ←§~~ affidavit, ~~§→ [or similar legal document,] ←§~~
an individual may, with like force and effect, provide an unsworn written document, subscribed
