11	General Description:
12	This bill modifies provisions of the Department of Community and Culture related to
13	the composition of the Utah Housing Corporation's board of trustees and the
14	distribution formula for Community Services Block Grant funds received by the State
15	Community Services Office.
16	Highlighted Provisions:
17	This bill:
18	 provides that one of the three ex officio trustees on the Utah Housing Corporation's
19	board of trustees shall be the executive director of the Department of Community
20	and Culture or the executive director's designee;
21	 modifies the distribution formula for federal Community Services Block Grant
22	funds received by the State Community Services Office; and
23	 makes certain technical changes.

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33	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
34	Section 1. Section 9-4-904 is amended to read:
35	9-4-904. Creation Trustees Terms Vacancies Chair Powers Quorum
36	Per diem and expenses.
37	(1) (a) There is created an independent body politic and corporate, constituting a public
38	corporation, known as the "Utah Housing Corporation."
39	(b) The corporation may also be known and do business as the:
40	(i) Utah Housing Finance Association; and
41	(ii) Utah Housing Finance Agency in connection with any contract entered into when
42	that was the corporation's legal name.
43	(c) Any other entity may not use the names described in Subsections (1)(a) and (b)
44	without the express approval of the corporation.
45	(2) The corporation shall be governed by a board of trustees composed of the following
46	nine trustees:
47	(a) three ex officio trustees who shall be:
48	(i) the executive director of the Department of Community and Culture or the
49	executive director's designee;
50	(ii) the commissioner of the Department of Financial Institutions or [his] the
51	commissioner's designee; and
52	(iii) the state treasurer or [his] the treasurer's designee; and
53	(b) six public trustees, being private citizens of the state, as follows:
54	(i) two people representing the mortgage lending industry;
55	(ii) two people representing the home building and real estate industry; and
56	(iii) two people representing the public at large.
57	(3) The governor shall:

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58 (a) appoint the six public trustees of the corporation with the consent of the Senate; and 59 (b) ensure that: (i) the six public trustees are from different counties and are residents of Utah; and 60 61 (ii) not more than three of the public trustees belong to the same political party. 62 (4) (a) Except as required by Subsection (4)(b), the six public trustees shall be 63 appointed to terms of office of four years each. 64 (b) Notwithstanding the requirements of Subsection (4)(a), the governor shall, at the time of appointment or reappointment, adjust the length of terms to ensure that the terms of 65 66 corporation trustees are staggered so that approximately half of the board is appointed every 67 two years. 68 (5) (a) Any of the six public trustees of the corporation may be removed from office for 69 cause either by the governor or by an affirmative vote of any six trustees of the corporation. 70 (b) When a vacancy occurs in the board of trustees for any reason, the replacement 71 shall be appointed for the unexpired term. 72 (c) Each public trustee shall hold office for the term of [his] appointment and until 73 [his] the trustee's successor has been appointed and qualified. 74 (d) Any public trustee is eligible for reappointment but may not serve more than two 75 full consecutive terms. 76 (6) (a) The governor shall select the chair of the corporation. 77 (b) The trustees shall elect from among their number a vice chair and other officers they may determine. 78 79 (7) (a) Five trustees of the corporation constitute a quorum for transaction of business. 80 (b) An affirmative vote of at least five trustees is necessary for any action to be taken 81 by the corporation. 82 [(b)] (c) A vacancy in the board of trustees may not impair the right of a quorum to exercise all rights and perform all duties of the corporation. 83 84 (8) (a) (i) Trustees who are not government employees may not receive compensation 85 or benefits for their services, but may receive a reasonable per diem and reimbursement

86	expenses incurred in the performance of the trustee's official duties at the rates established by
87	the board of trustees.
88	(ii) Trustees may decline to receive per diem and expenses for their service.
89	(b) (i) State government officer and employee trustees who do not receive salary, per
90	diem, or expenses from their agency for their service may receive per diem and expenses
91	incurred in the performance of their official duties from the corporation at the rates established
92	by the Division of Finance under Sections 63A-3-106 and 63A-3-107.
93	(ii) State government officer and employee trustees may decline to receive per diem
94	and expenses for their service.

96	9-4-1405. Distribution of Community Services Block Grant funds.
97	Community Services Block Grant funds received by the office shall be distributed as
98	follows:
99	(1) 90% to community action agencies;
100	(2) 5% to <u>:</u>
101	(a) organizations with a statewide focus to accomplish specific objectives that
102	complement the Community Services Block Grant poverty programs; [and]
103	(b) provide training and technical assistance for grantees of Community Block Grant
104	<u>funds; or</u>
105	(c) supplement anti-poverty projects; and
106	(3) 5% to[: (a)] reimburse costs incurred by the office in administration of this part[;].
