Mr. Speaker:

The Transportation Committee reports a favorable recommendation on **H.B. 298, DRIVER LICENSE - APPLICATION OF MINOR**, by Representative D. Litvack, with the following amendments:

1. *Page 1, Lines 10 through 11:*

10 This bill modifies the Utah Human Services Code and Driver Licensing Act by
amending provisions related to

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foster home services.

(1) The office shall require a child placing agency that provides foster home services to notify a foster parent that if the foster parent signs as the responsible adult for a foster child to receive a driver license under Section 53-3-211, the foster parent is jointly and severally liable with the minor for civil compensatory damages caused by the minor when operating a motor vehicle upon a highway as provided under Subsections 53-3-211(3) and (4).

(2) In accordance with Title 63, Chapter 46a, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, the office may make rules establishing the procedures for a child placing agency to provide the notification required under this section.
