Mr. Speaker:

The Business and Labor Committee recommends **1st Sub. S.B. 69**, PROTECTION OF INFORMATION IN CONSUMER CREDIT DATABASES, by Senator C. Walker, be replaced and reports a favorable recommendation on **2nd Sub. S.B. 69**, PROTECTION OF INFORMATION IN CONSUMER CREDIT DATABASES with the following amendments:

1. *Page 3, Line 81 through Page 4, Line 88:*

- 81 13-42-202. Personal information -- Disclosure of system security breach.
- 82 (1) (a) A person who owns or licenses computerized data that includes personal
- 83 information concerning {~~a~~} **more than 5,000** {~~Utah resident~~
- 84 ~~persons~~ shall, when the person becomes aware of a breach of
- 85 system security, conduct in good faith a reasonable and prompt investigation to determine
- 86 the
- 87 likelihood that personal information has been or will be misused.
- 88 (b) If an investigation under Subsection (1)(a) reveals that the misuse of personal
- 89 information has occurred, or is reasonably likely to occur, the person shall provide
- 90 notification
- 91 to each affected Utah resident.
- 92 **(c) A person who owns or licenses computerized data that includes personal**
- 93 **information concerning 5,000 or fewer persons shall provide notification of a breach**
- 94 **of system security to a Utah resident whose personal information is compromised if**
- 95 **the person has actual knowledge that the resident's personal information is**
- 96 **compromised.**
