H.B. 56 Sex Offender Registration Amendments (Rep. M. S. Lawrence)

Rep. Lawrence introduced the bill assisted by Dan Mulvanato, Director, Juvenile Justice System.

H.B. 60 Controlled Substance Amendments (Rep. C. Oda)

 - 221 <u>the special programs</u> <u> _ {and } services</u> <u>, and entitlements</u> <u>provided by the United States to Indians because of their</u>
 - status as Indians.

The motion passed unanimously.
