	WHEREAS, in order to accommodate public officials, visitors, and employees who
	park their vehicles near Capitol Hill, the Capitol Hill Master Plan calls for an evaluation of
	long-term parking needs and a reconfiguration of the northeast parking area and sidewalks;

WHEREAS, the Capitol Preservation Board recently conducted a review of options for
public official and employee parking on the State Capitol Complex;

WHEREAS, as a result of that review, the Capitol Preservation Board has recommended that a public official and employee underground parking structure be constructed east of the state capitol building and that the northeast Capitol Hill parking area be reconfigured;

WHEREAS, because the state capitol building is currently closed for restoration and for seismic base-isolation improvements, and because the state capitol grounds are affected by that restoration and other construction, the Capitol Preservation Board concluded that it would be more efficient to construct an underground parking structure east of the state capitol building now rather than excavating the area later; and

WHEREAS, the appropriations by the Utah Legislature to the Capitol Preservation Board for the restoration and other construction on the State Capitol Complex did not include authorization for the Board to use those monies to construct an underground parking structure east of the state capitol building and to reconfigure the northeast Capitol Hill parking area:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Capitol Preservation Board is authorized to use up to \$15 million from its existing legislative appropriations to construct an underground parking structure east of the state capitol building and to reconfigure the northeast Capitol Hill parking area, with an estimated completion date for both of January 2008.

#### **State Impact**

Passage of this bill would authorize the Capitol Preservation Board (CPB) to expend up to \$15,000,000 from its current FY 2007 appropriation for parking area construction. Since the current FY 2007 appropriation is insufficient for already-scheduled work on the Capitol plus the parking being considered in this bill, a future supplemental appropriation of up to \$15,000,000 would be required to complete the FY 2007 scheduled work on the Capitol.

### **Individual and Business Impact**

No fiscal impact.
