

Senator Darin G. Peterson proposes the following substitute bill:

REDISTRICTING PLAN

LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill modifies statutory provisions governing Utah's United States Congressional districts.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ repeals the four-member Congressional plan enacted in 2001;
- ▶ establishes new boundaries to create four United States Congressional districts in Utah;
- ▶ establishes certain maps as the legal boundaries of those Congressional districts;
- ▶ takes effect upon the occurrence of certain contingencies; and
- ▶ provides a legislative intent statement.

Monies Appropriated in this Bill:

None

Other Special Clauses:

This bill provides an immediate effective date for Section 2.

This bill provides a contingent effective date for Sections 1, 3, and 5.

This bill provides revisor instructions.



Utah Code Sections Affected:

REPEALS AND REENACTS:

20A-13-101, as repealed and reenacted by Chapter 6, Laws of Utah 2001, Second Special Session

REPEALS:

Chapter 7, Laws of Utah 2001, Second Special Session

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. Section **20A-13-101** is repealed and reenacted to read:

20A-13-101. **Representatives to the United States Congress -- Four representative districts -- When elected -- District boundaries.**

(1) (a) Utah is divided into four districts for the election of representatives to the Congress of the United States, with one member to be elected from each Congressional district.

(b) At each general election held after this section takes effect, and at any special election called by the governor to elect one or more members of Congress held within one year after this section takes effect, one representative from each Congressional district shall be elected to serve in the Congress of the United States.

(2) (a) The Legislature adopts the official census population figures and maps of the Bureau of the Census of the United States Department of Commerce developed in connection with the taking of the 2000 national decennial census as the official data for establishing Congressional district boundaries.

(b) The numbers and boundaries of the Congressional districts are designated and established by the maps attached to the bill that enacts this section.

Section 2. Repealer.

This bill repeals:

Chapter 7, Laws of Utah 2001, Second Special Session, which contains Section 20A-13-101 (Contingently Effective).

Section 3. Intent statement.

It is the intent of the Legislature that:

(1) the four Congressional districts enacted in this S.B. 5001 replace, on the dates that S.B. 5001 takes effect, the three Congressional districts repealed and reenacted in S.B. 2002,

Chapter 6, Laws of Utah 2001, Second Special Session; and

(2) if necessary, the governor convene the Legislature into a special session to resolve any conflicts with statutory provisions governing the electoral process so that four Congressional representatives can be elected as soon as reasonably possible.

Section 4. **Contingent effective date.**

(1) If approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, Section 2, Repealer, of this bill takes effect immediately upon approval by the governor, or the day following the constitutional time limit of Utah Constitution Article VII, Section 8, without the governor's signature, or in the case of a veto, the date of veto override.

(2) Section 1, Section 3, and Section 5 of this bill take effect:

(a) for purposes of nominating and electing members of the United States House of Representatives, when the Clerk of the United States House of Representatives certifies to the state of Utah that it is entitled to four representatives in the United States House of Representatives; and

(b) for all other purposes, on the date that the state board of canvassers declares four Congressional representatives from Utah elected after the first statewide special or regular general election held after the date that certification from the Clerk of the United States House of Representatives is received.

Section 5. **Revisor instructions.**

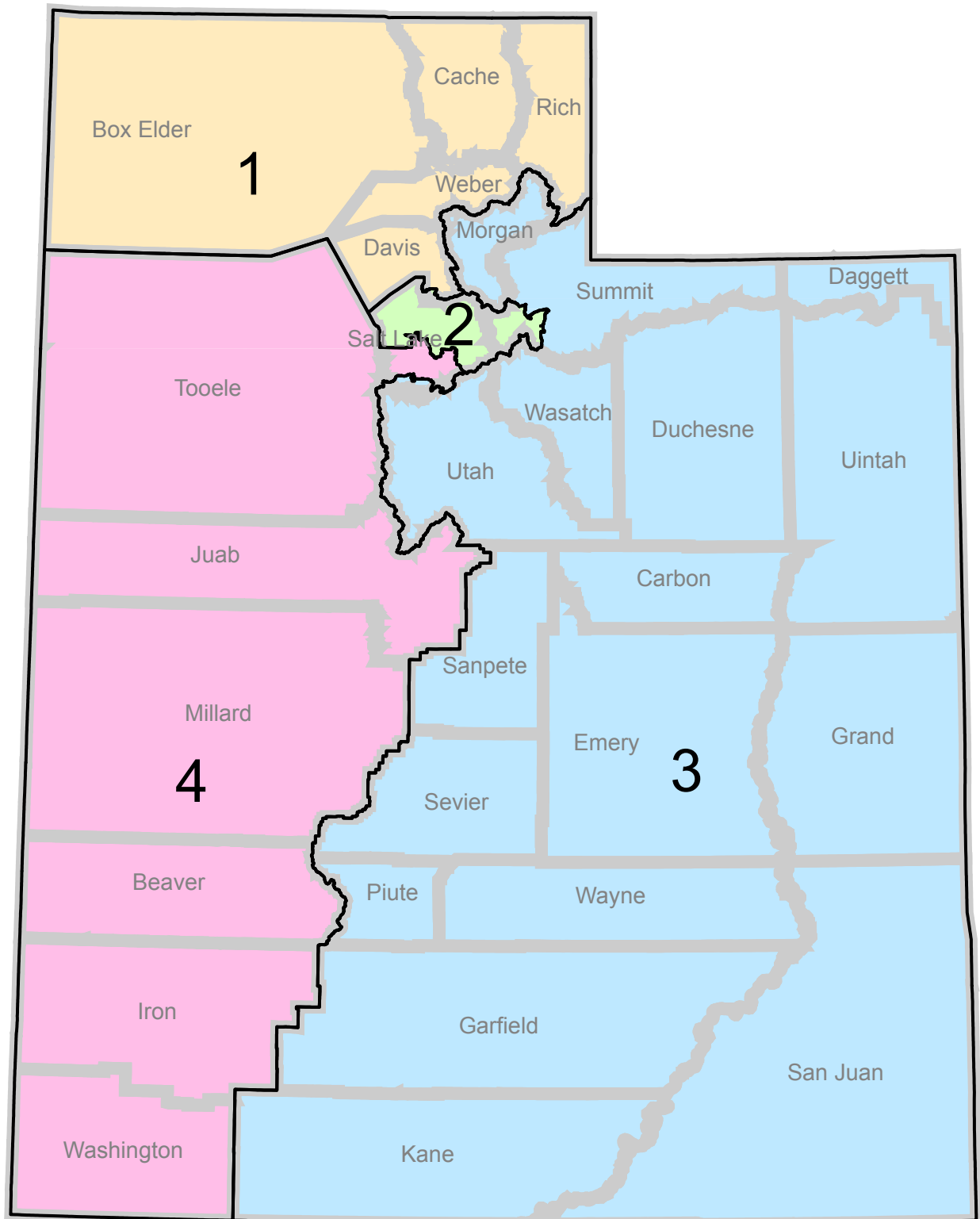
When the provisions in this bill take effect as provided in Section 4, it is the intent of the Legislature that the Office of Legislative Research and General Counsel:

(1) update the Utah Code database so that Section 20A-13-101 in this bill supersedes the provisions of Section 20A-13-101 contained in S.B. 2002, Chapter 6, Laws of Utah 2001, Second Special Session; and

(2) in Subsection 20A-13-101(1)(b), replace "this section takes effect" with the actual effective date of this bill.

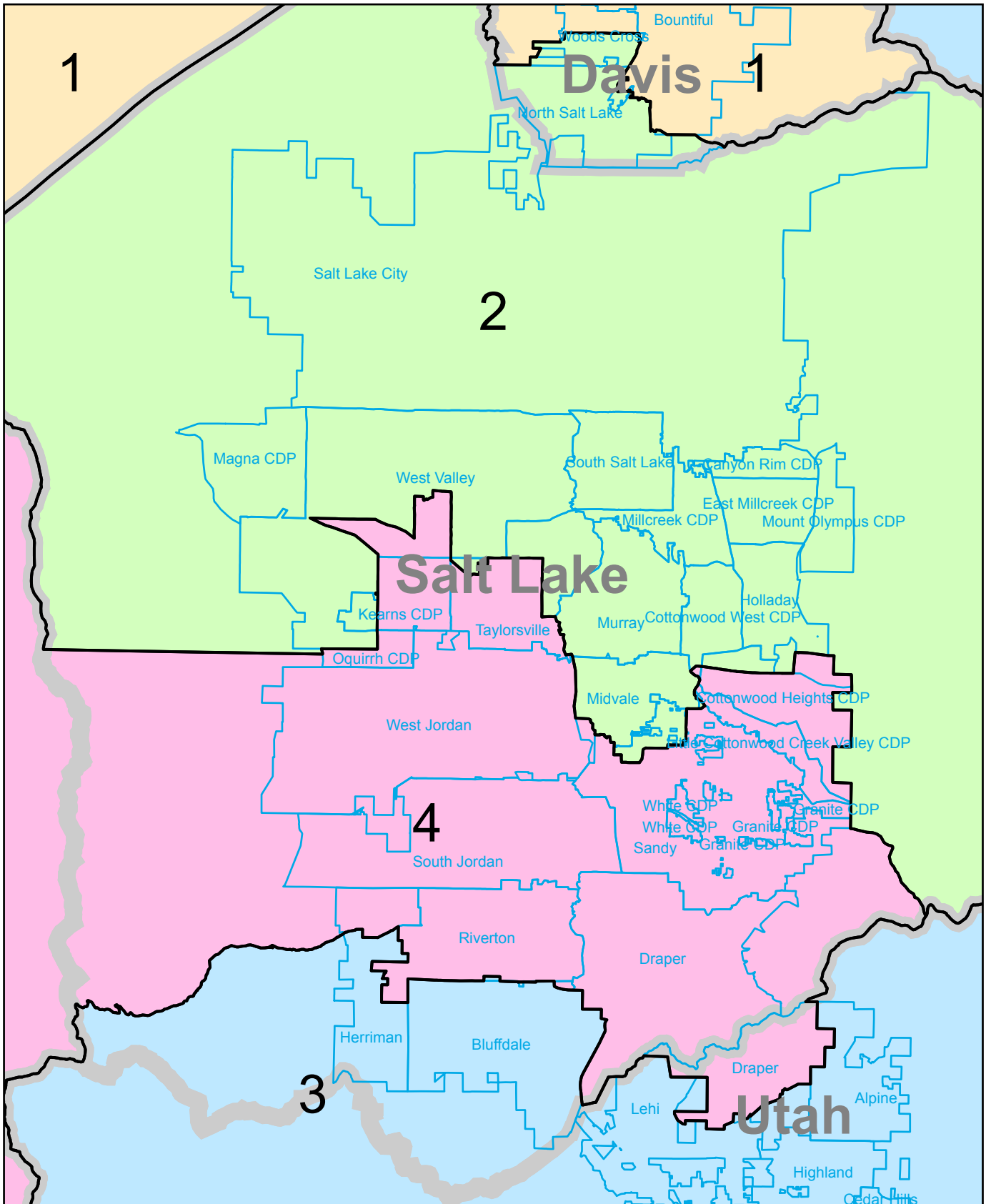

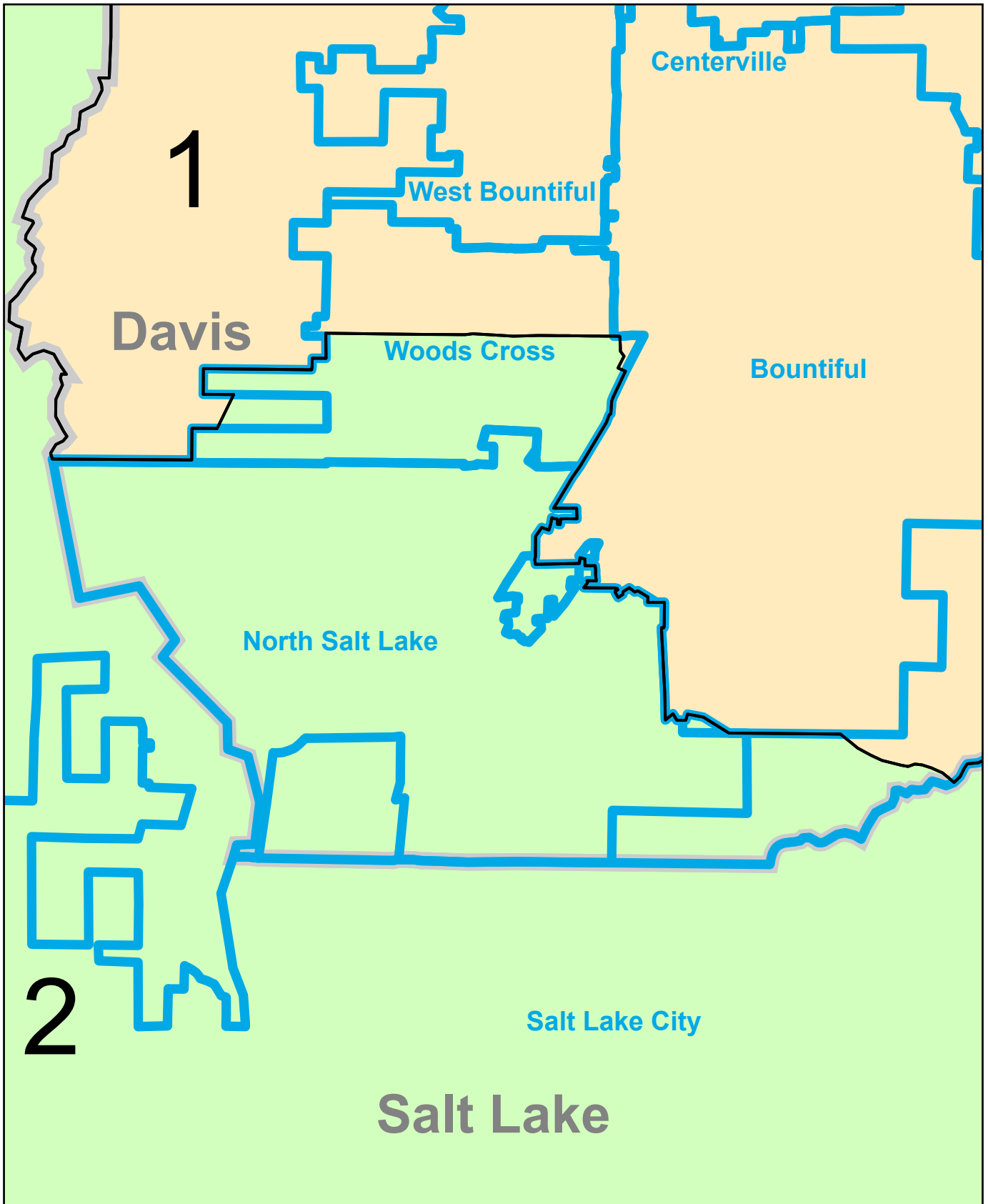
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Map 2 --- Davis, Salt Lake, and Utah Counties

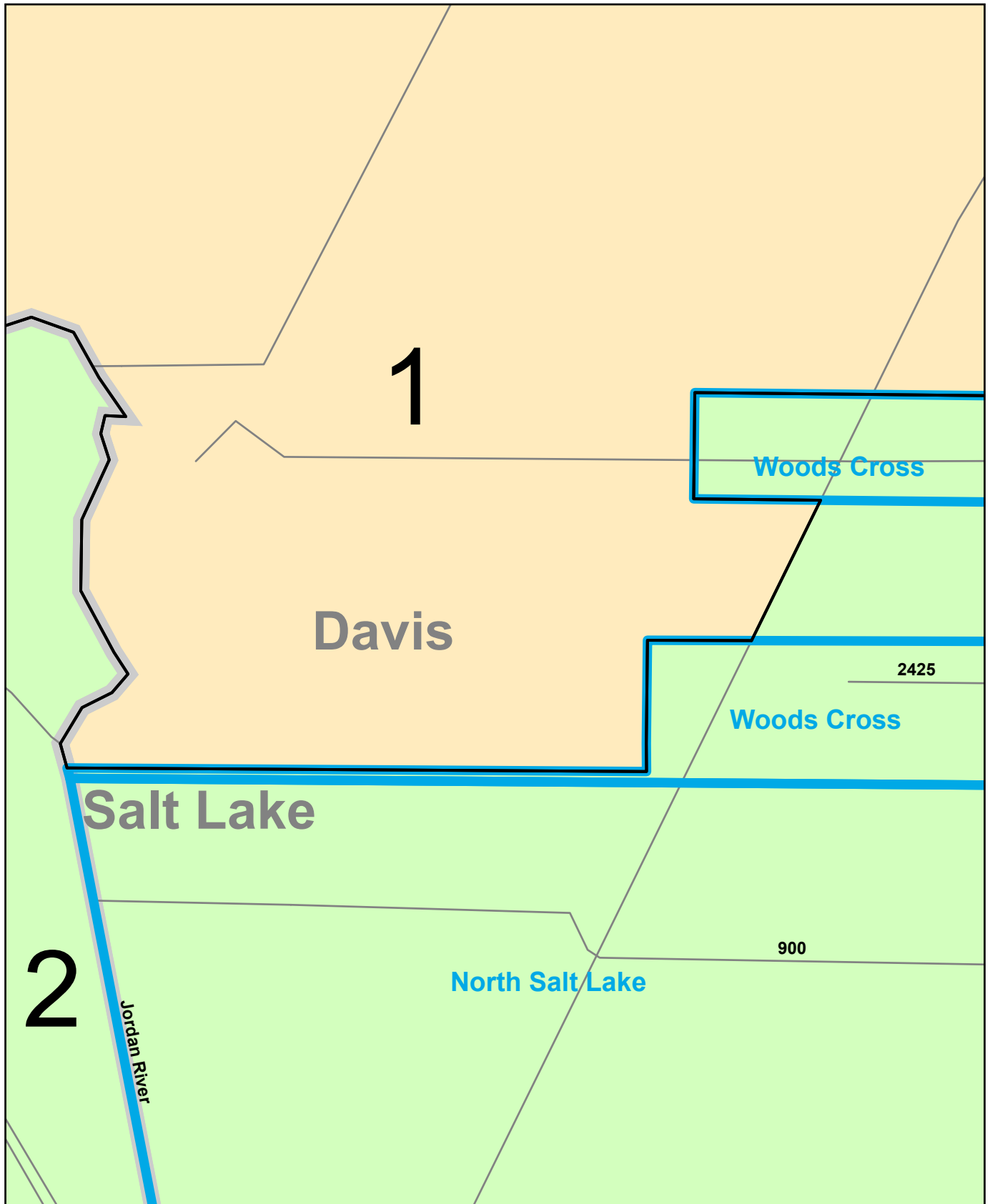

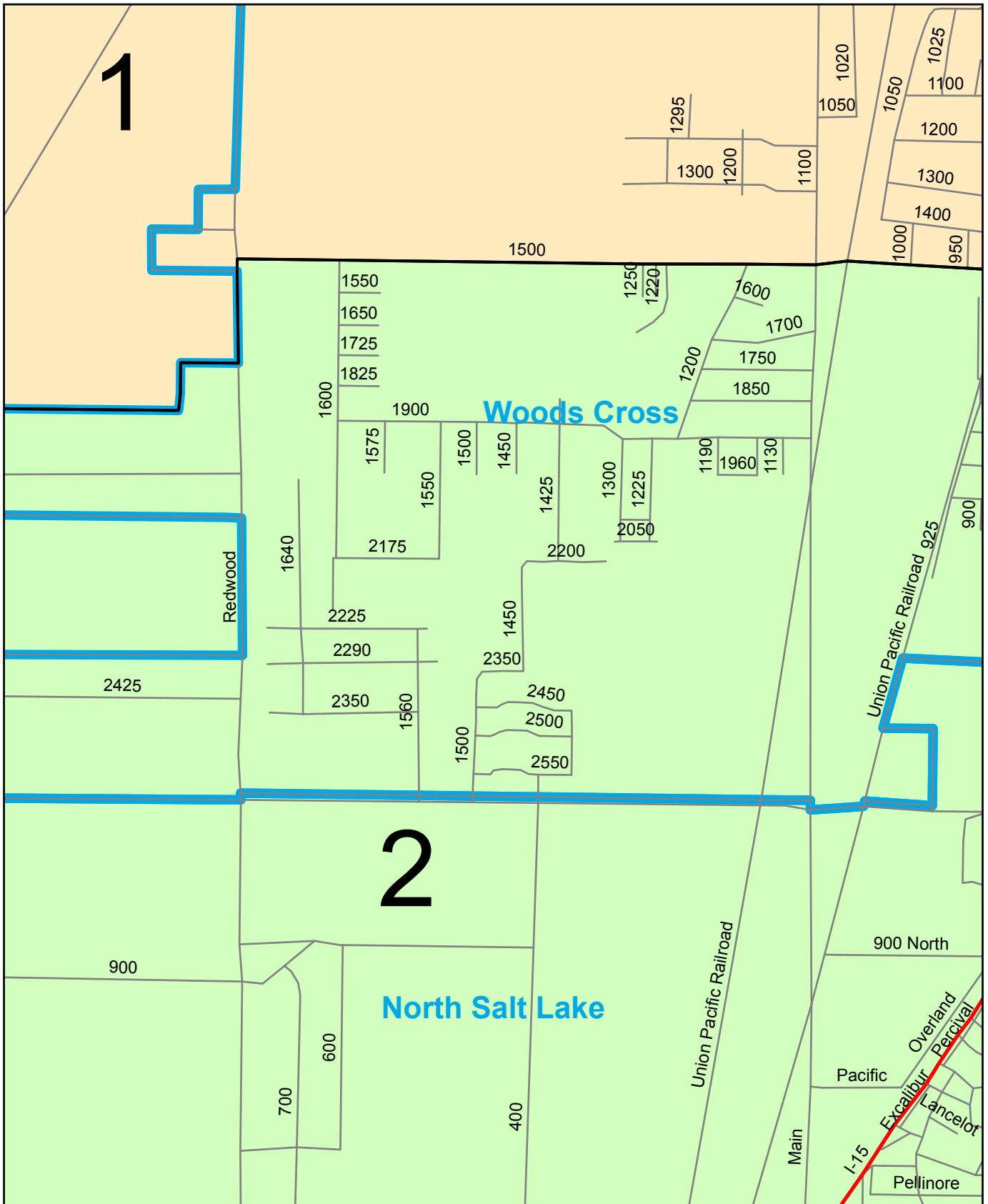

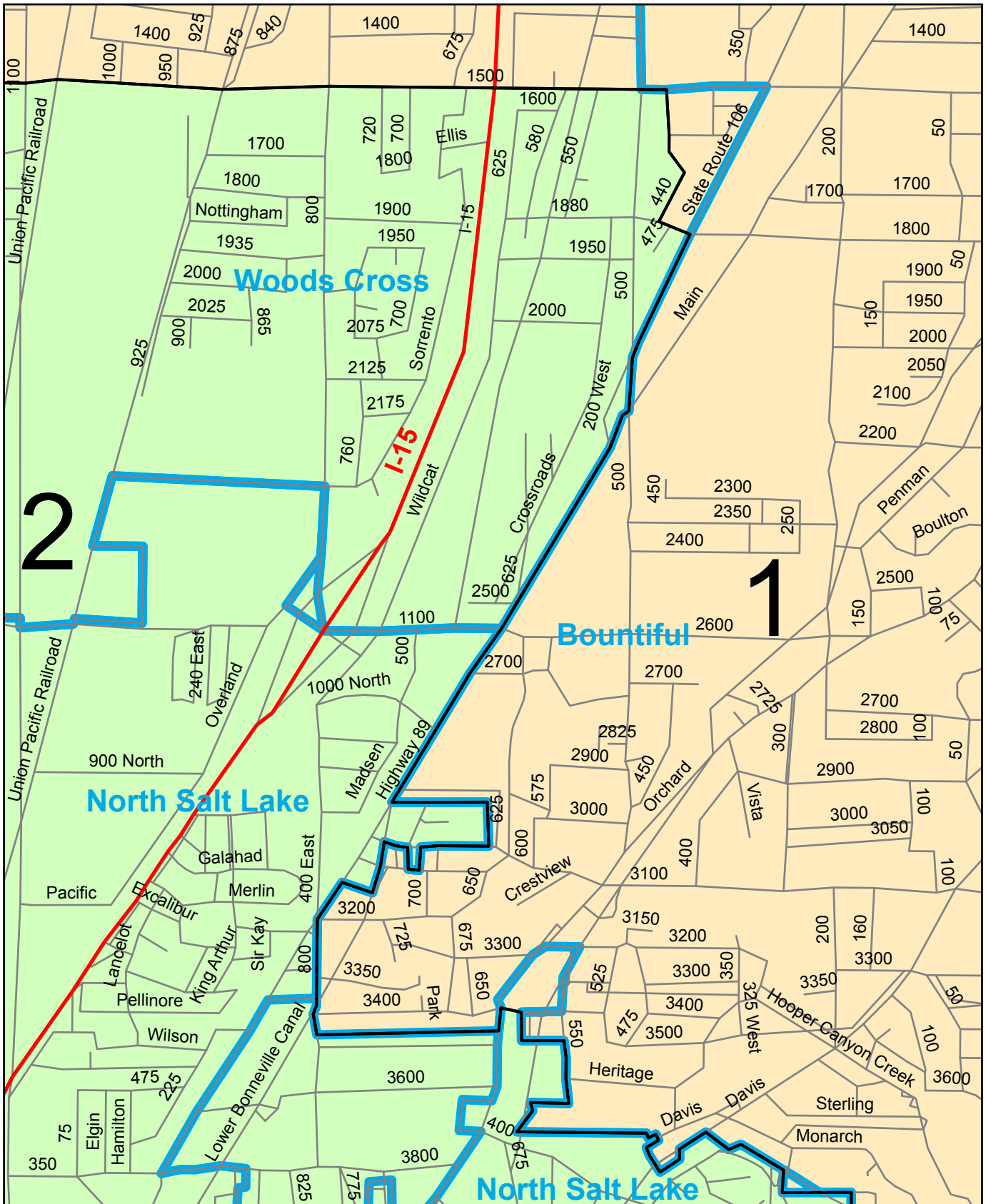

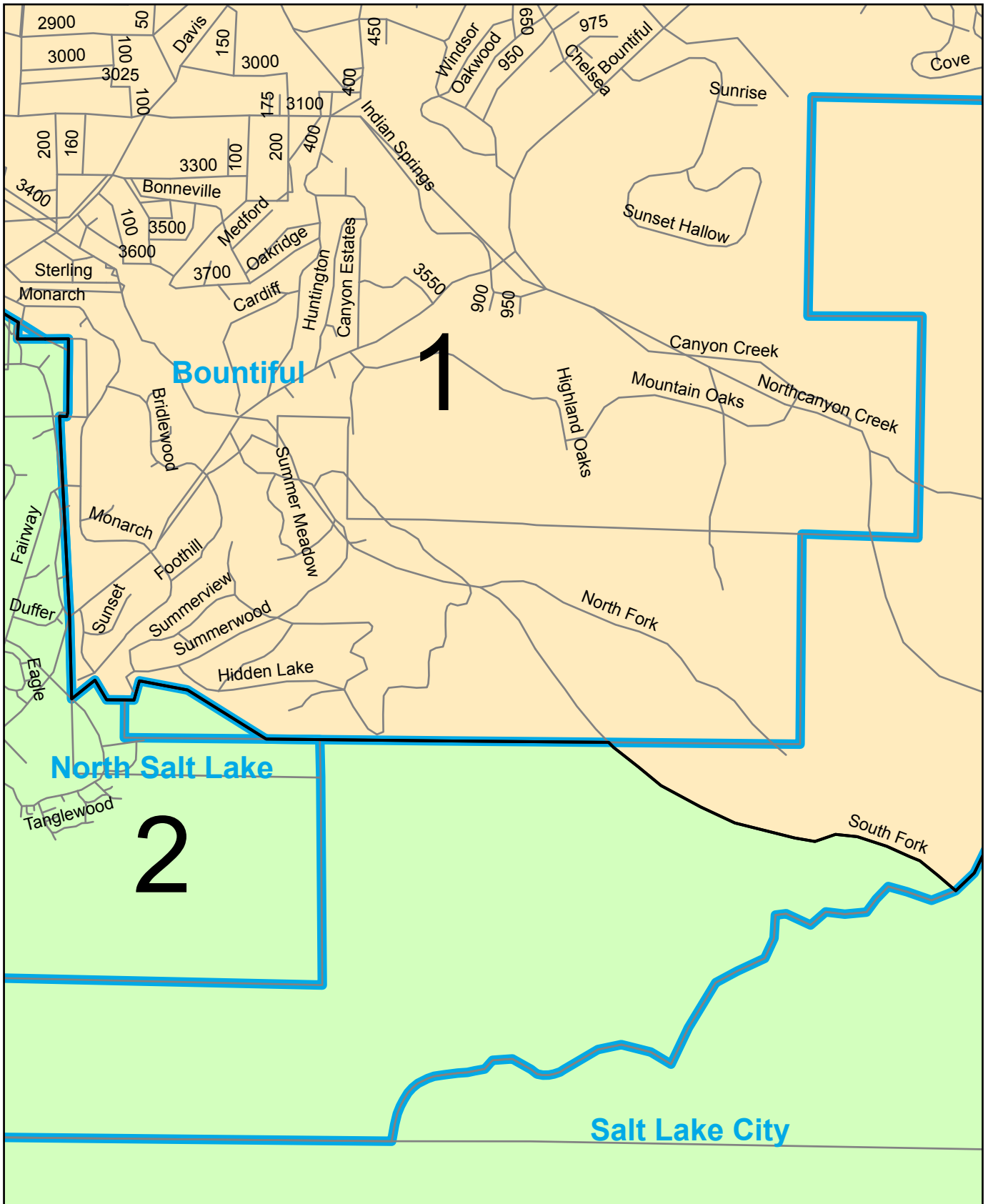
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Map 6 --- Davis County

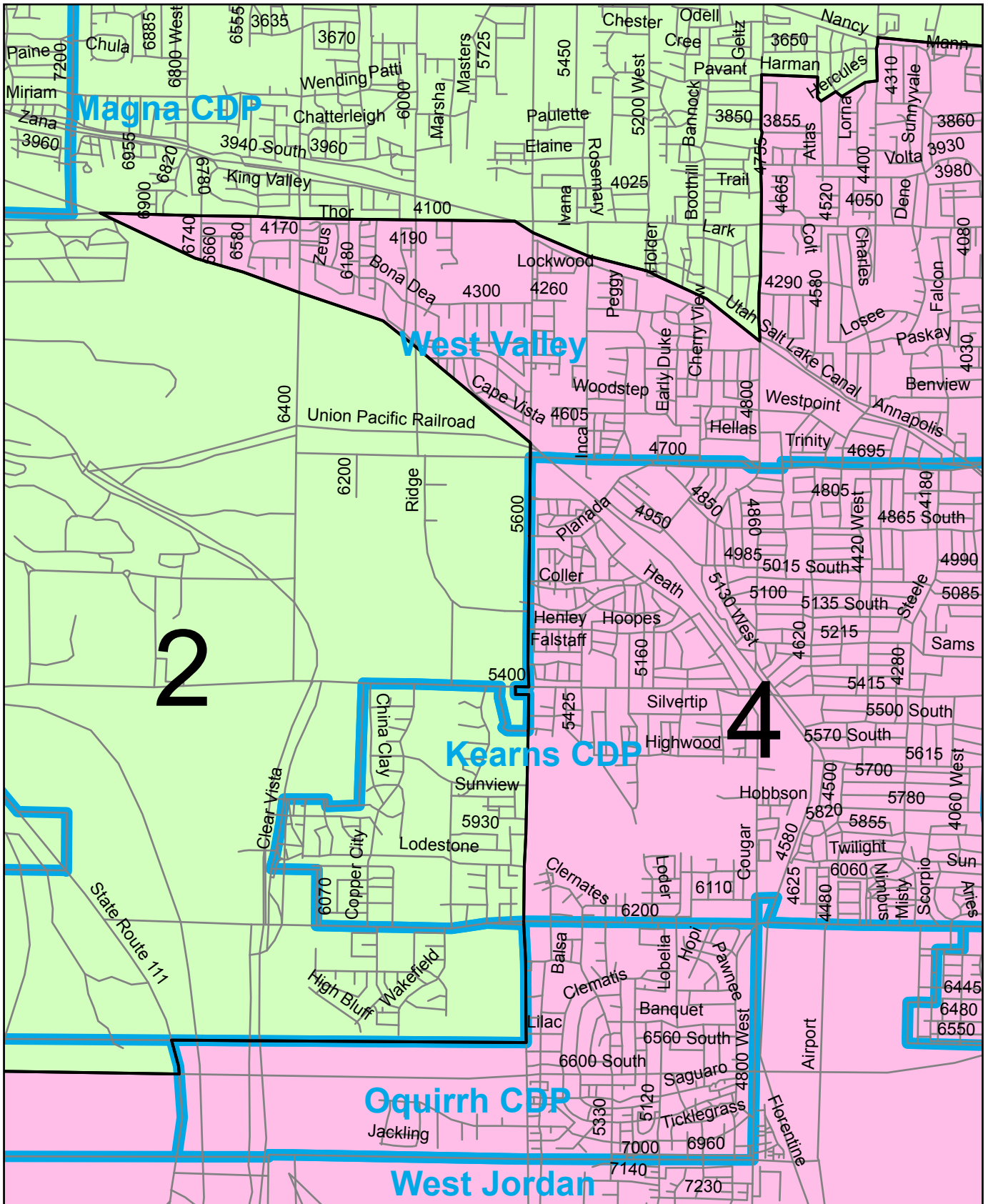
Map 7 --- Davis County

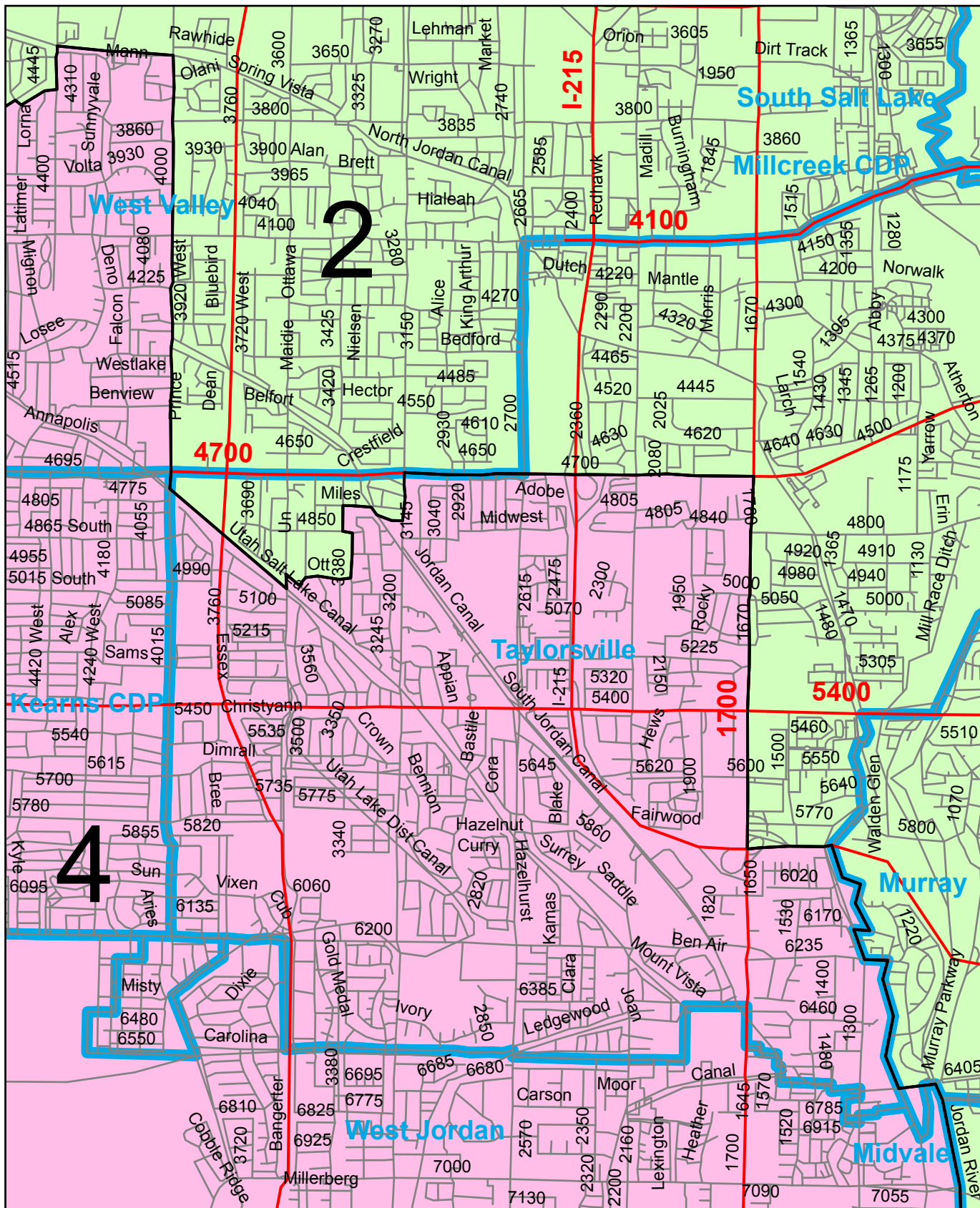
Map 8 --- Salt Lake County

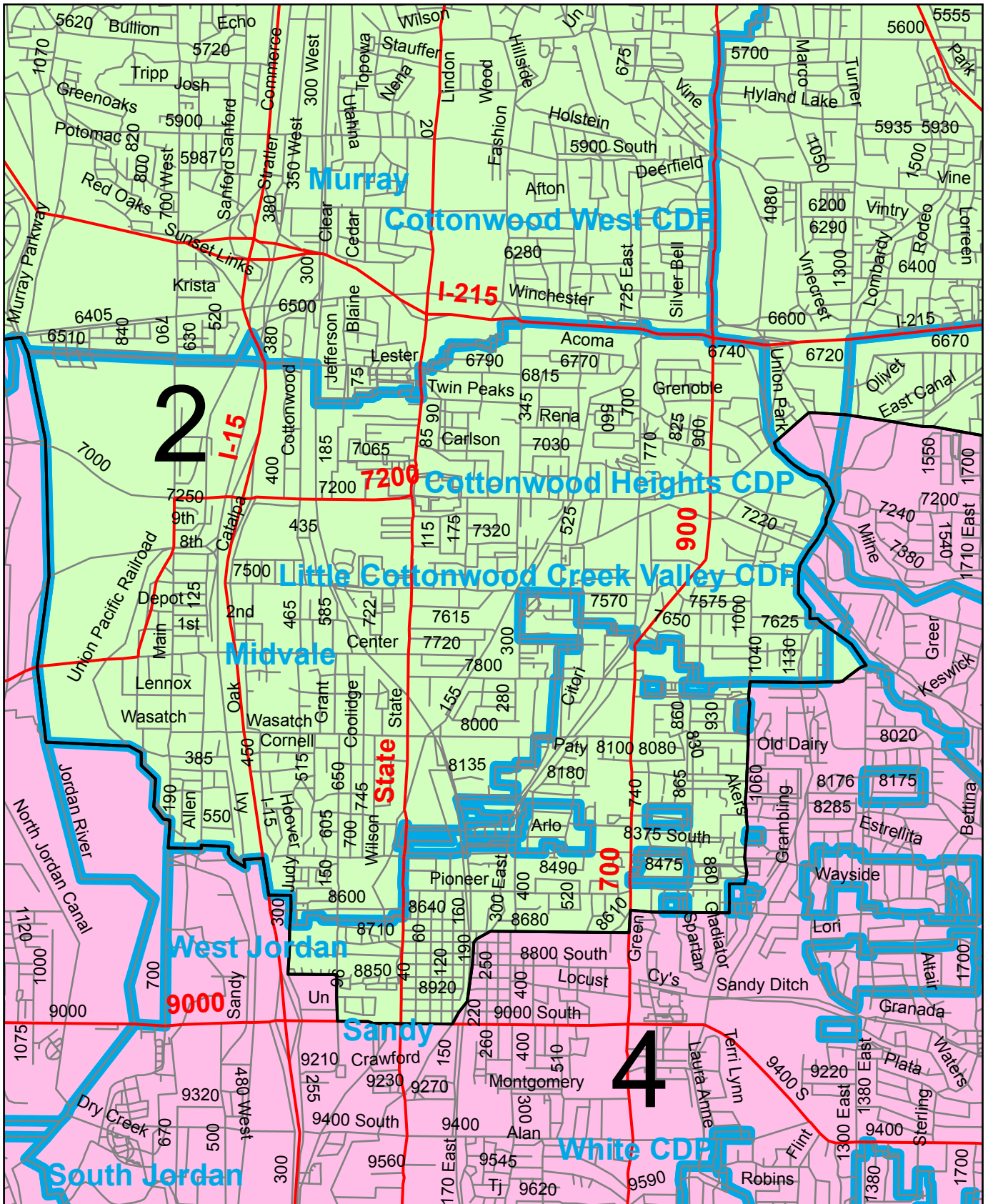

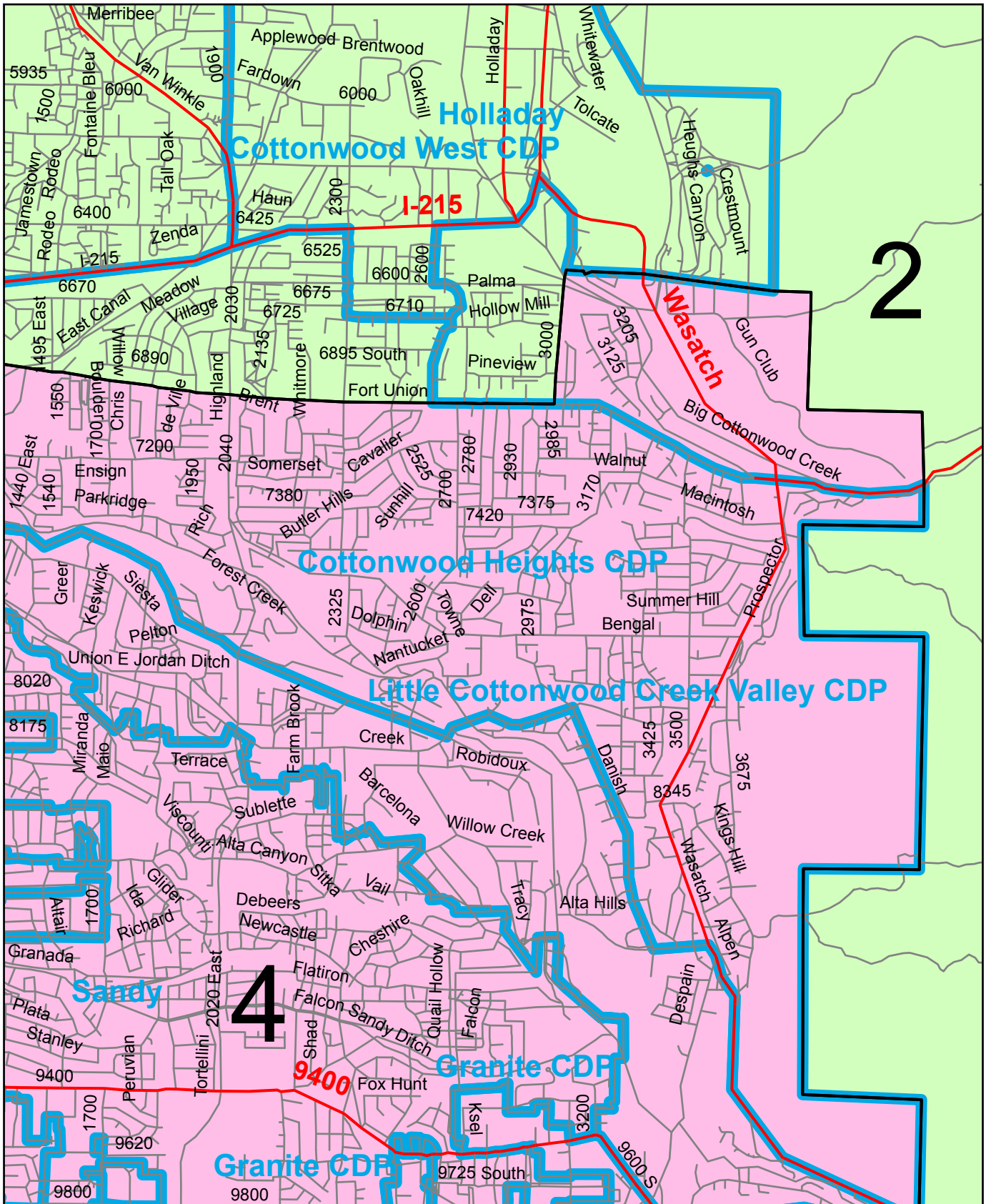

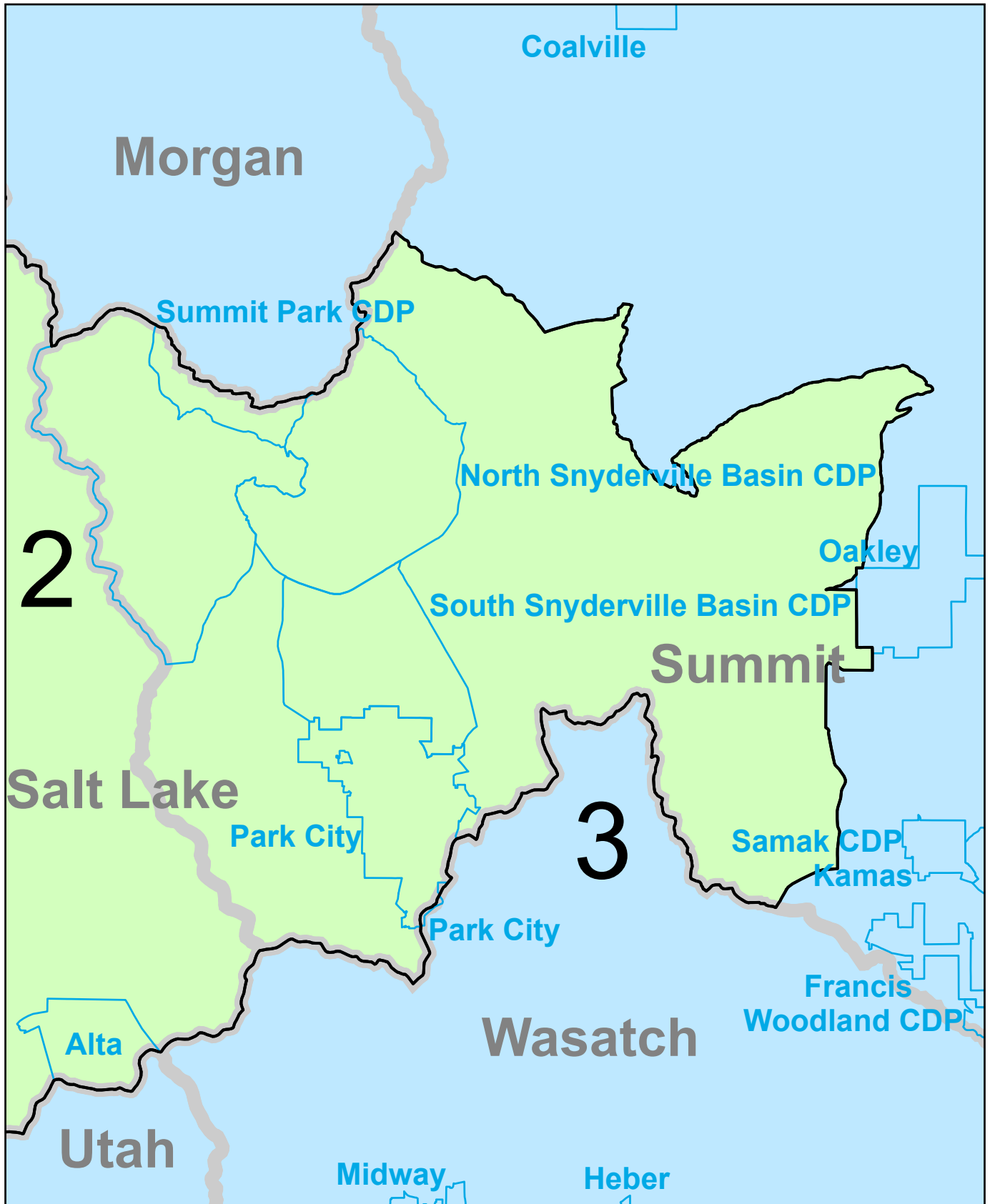

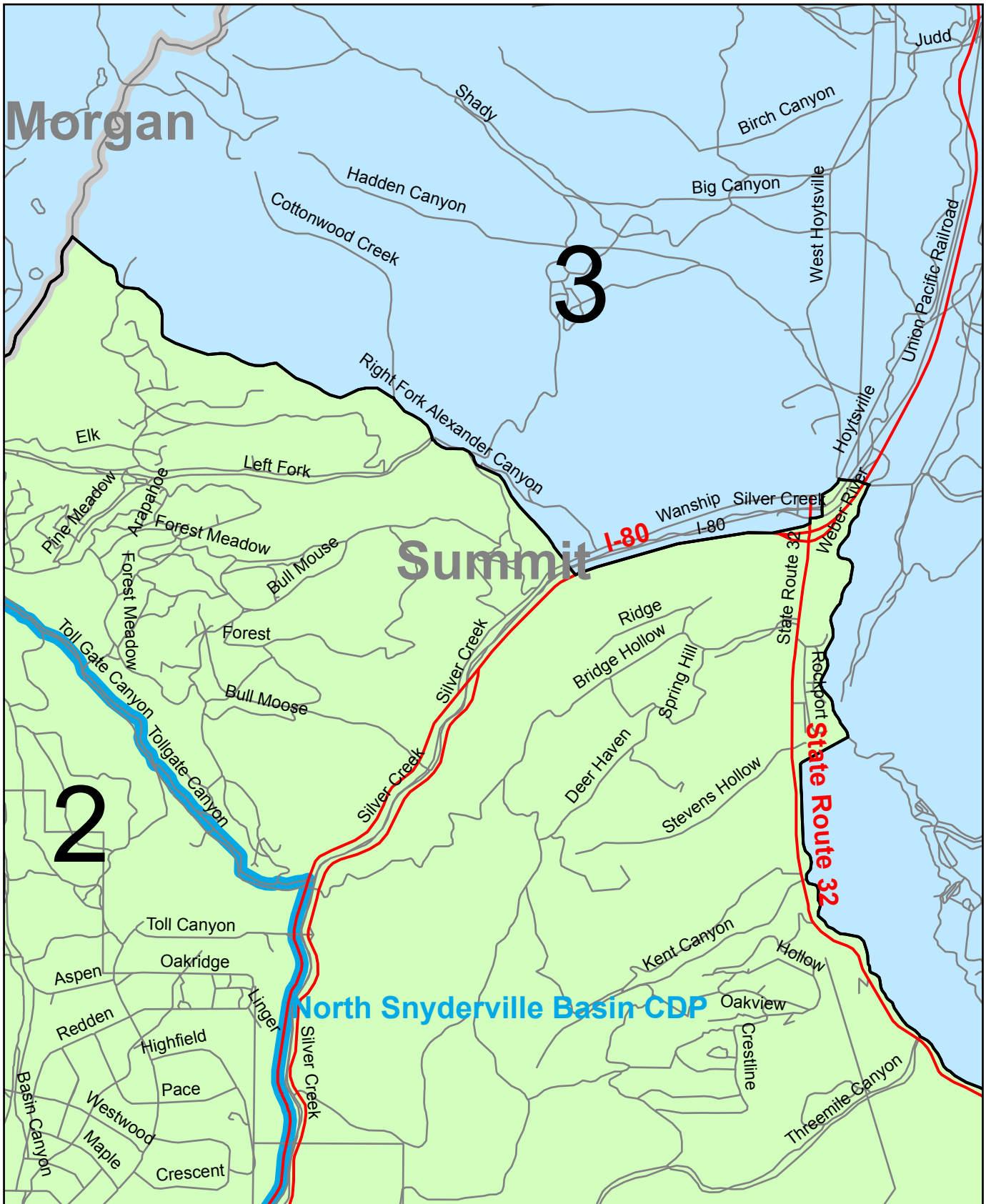

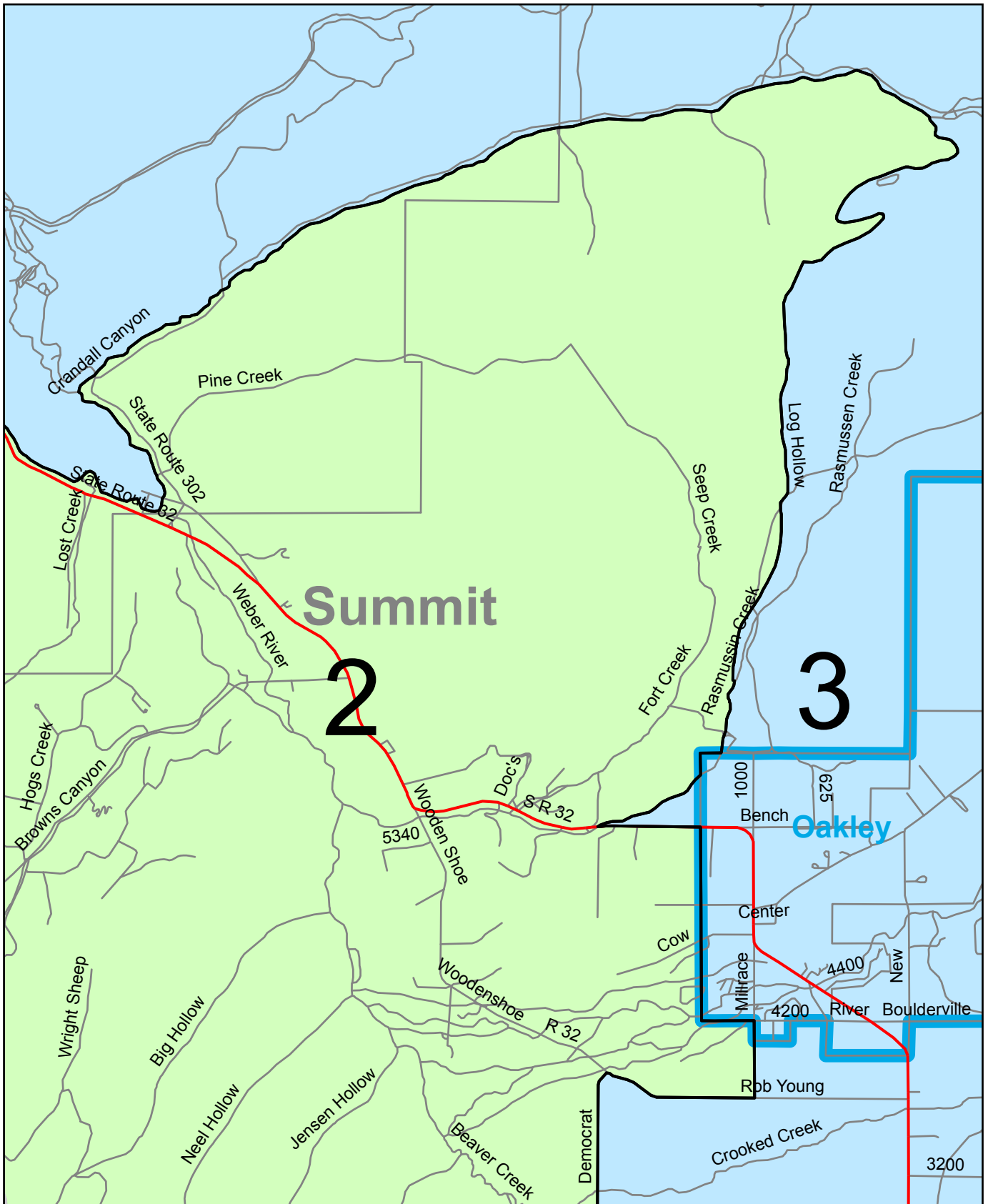
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Map 13 --- Summit County

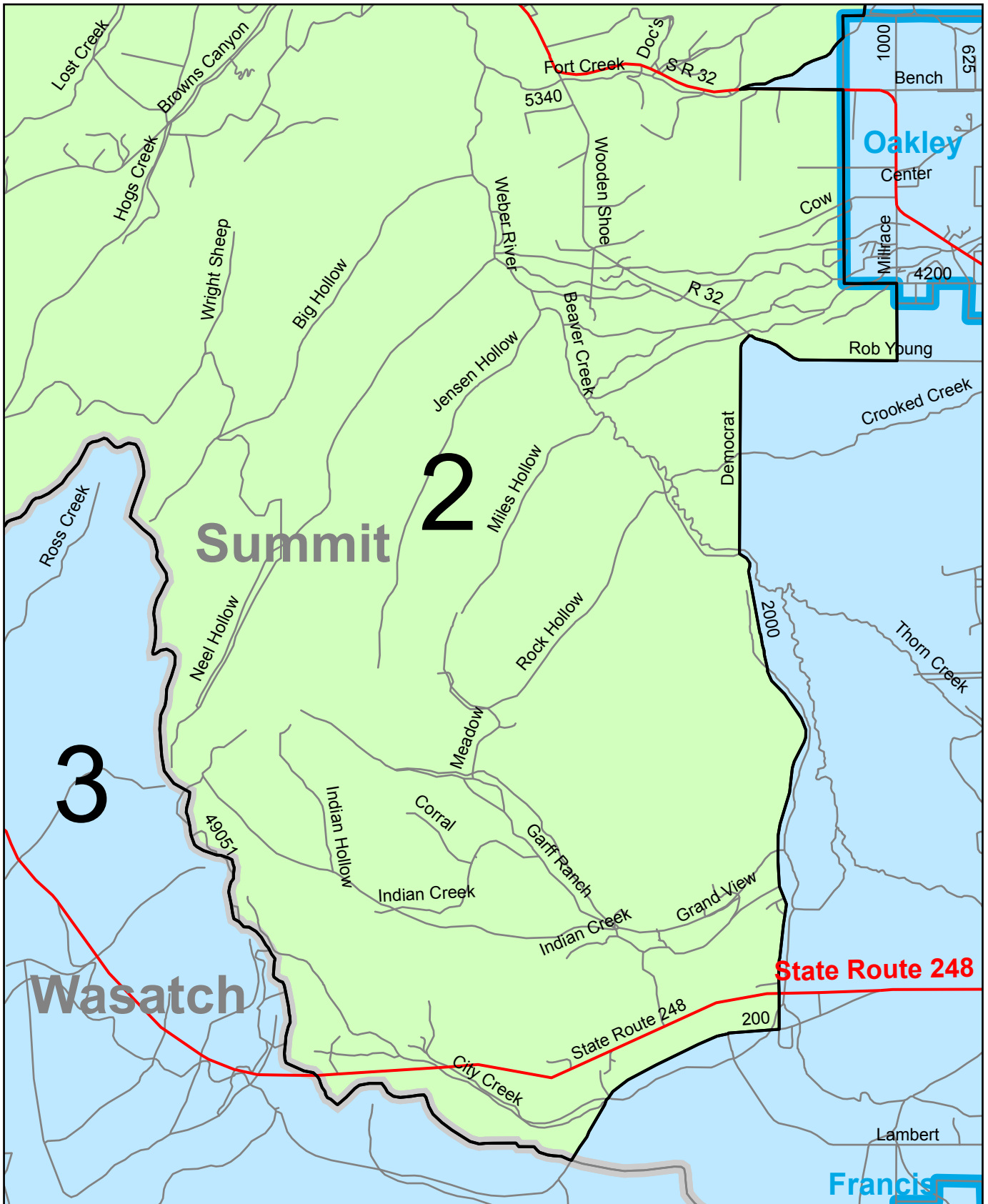
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Map 14 --- Summit County

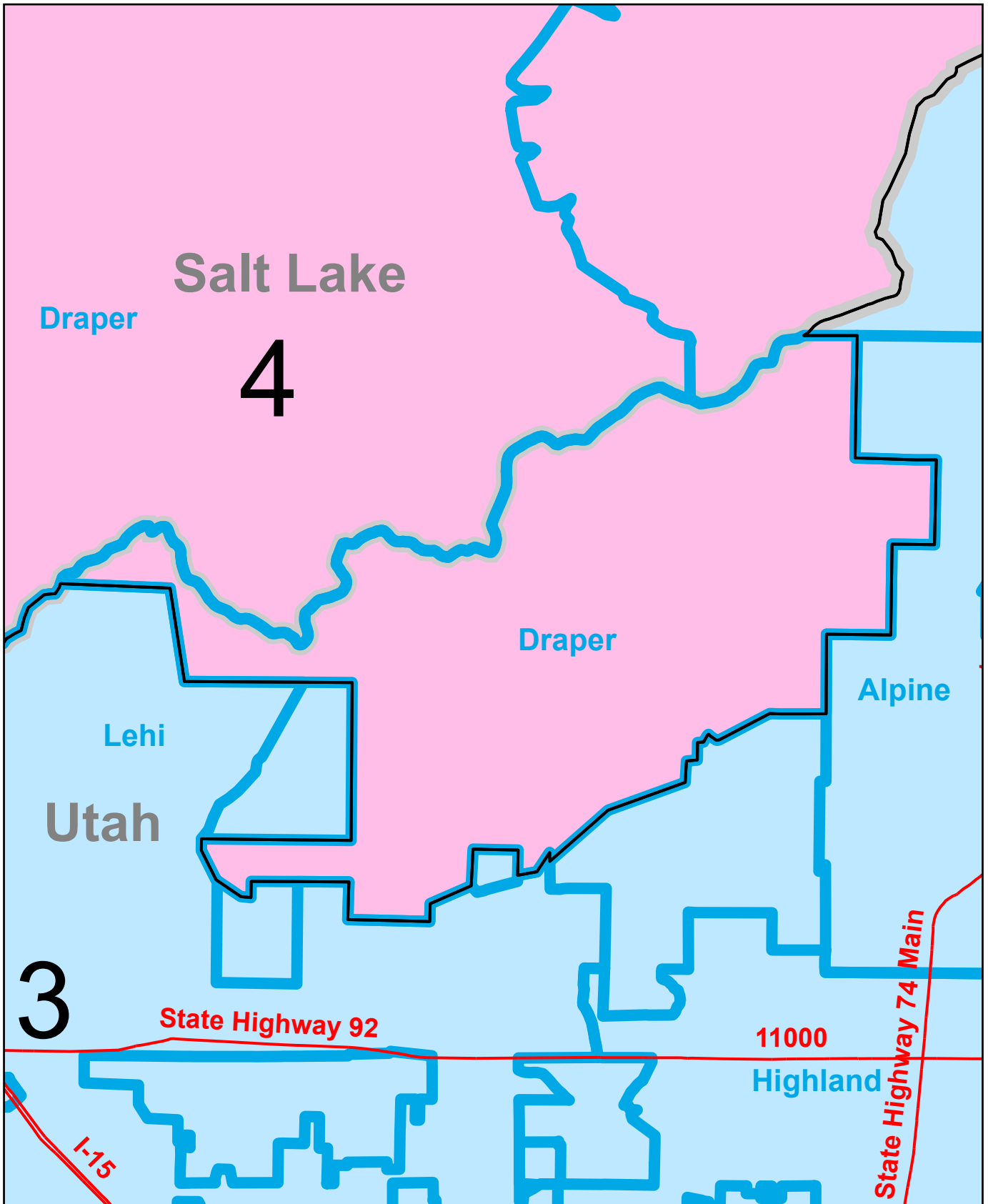
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Map 15 --- Summit County

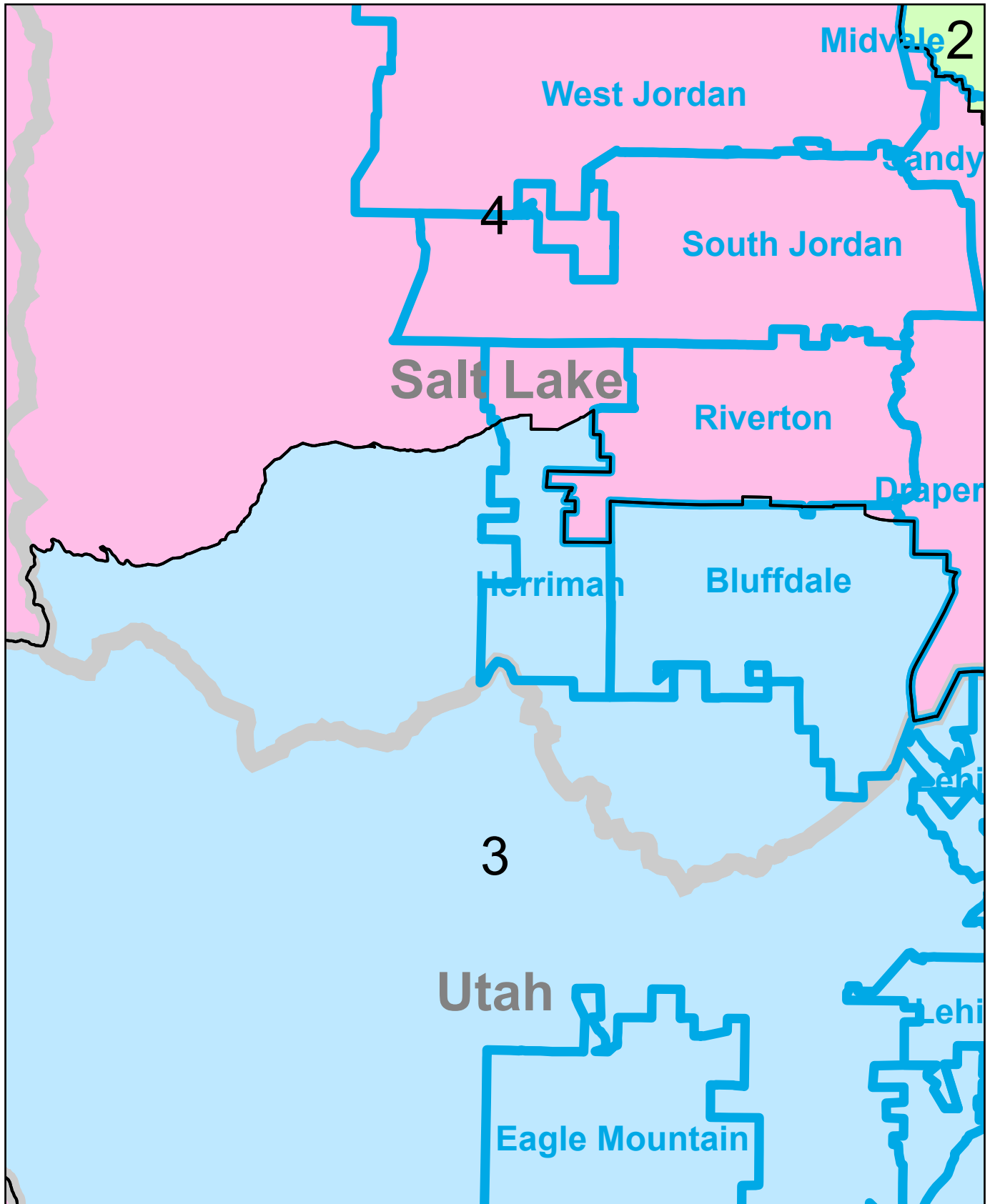
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Map 16 --- Utah County

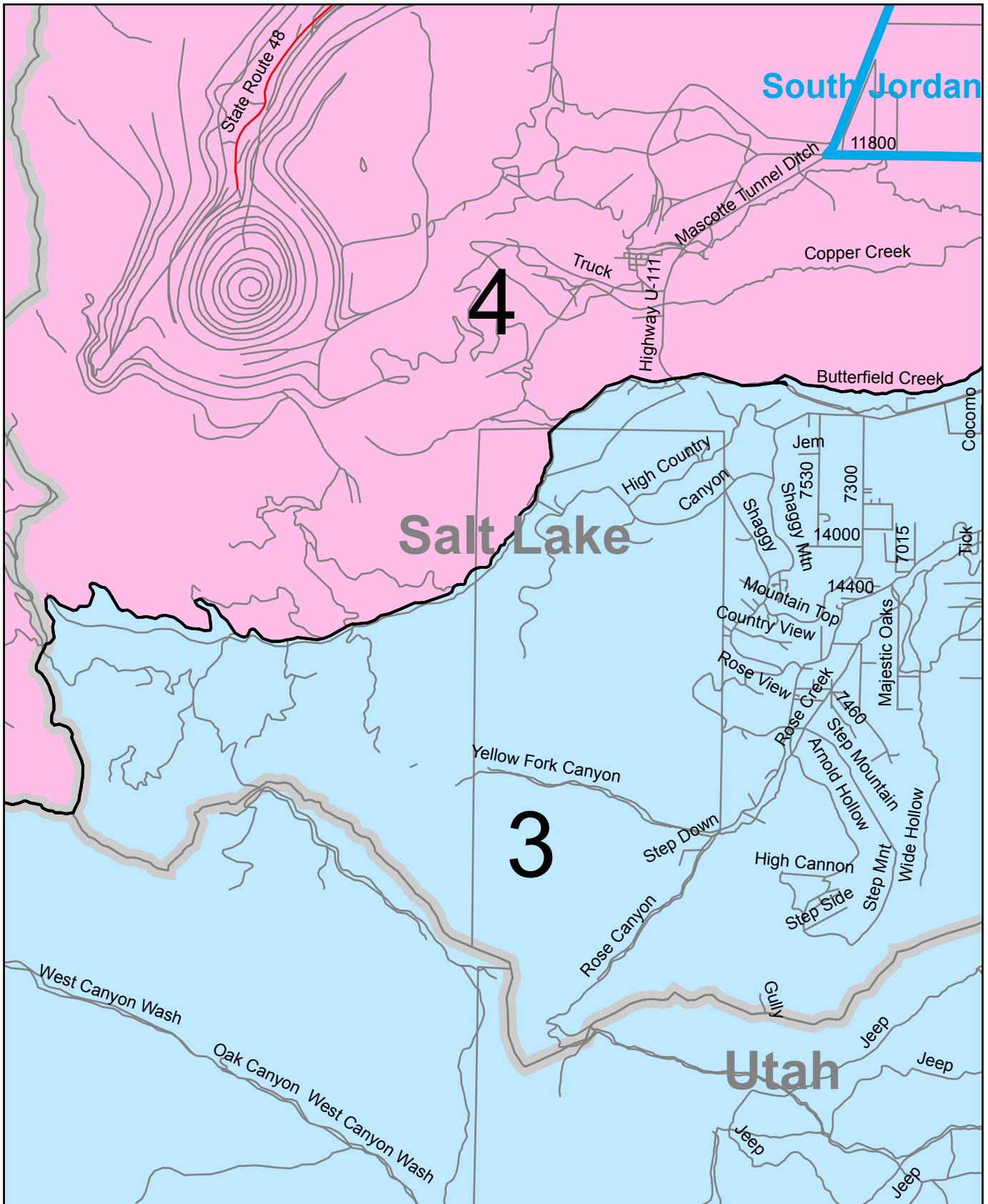
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Map 17 --- Salt Lake County

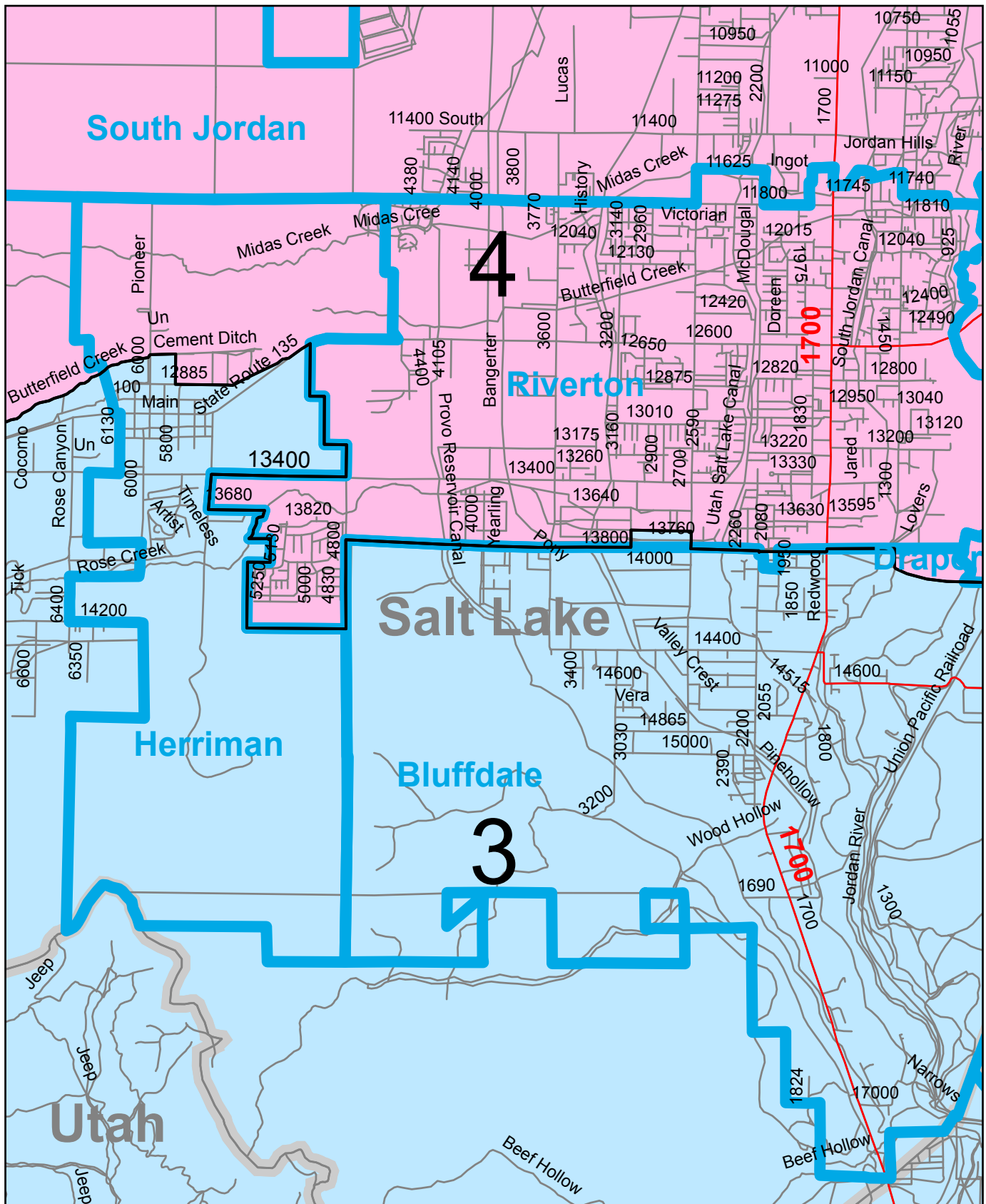


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Map 18 --- Salt Lake County

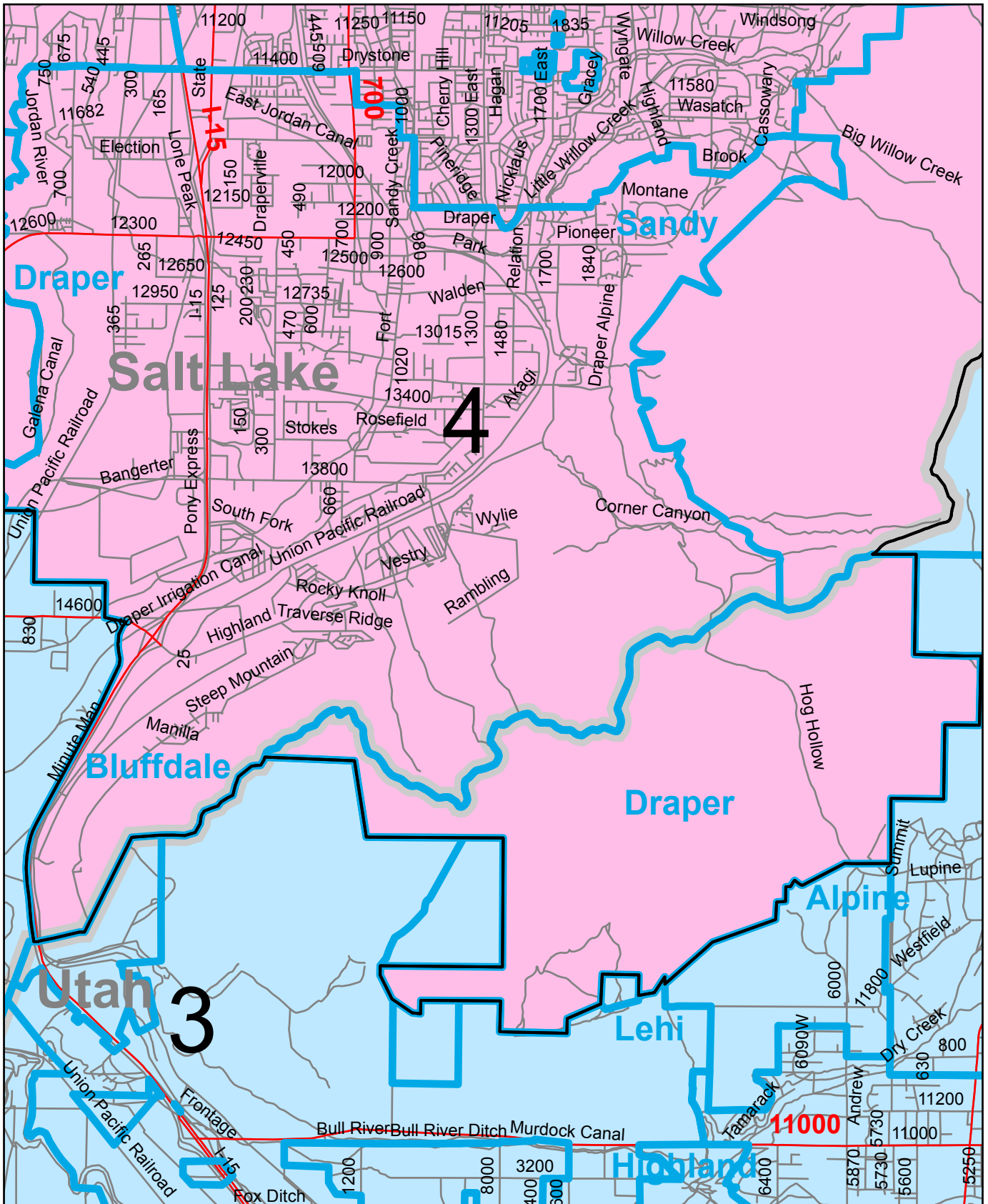
