programs as permitted by Section 9-1-202, which may include:

(B) Title 26, Chapter 40, Utah Children's Health Insurance Act;	
(ii) Chapter 12, Home Energy Assistance Target (HEAT) Program:	
(iii) the WIC program;	
(iv) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant; and	
(v) other food and housing assistance programs.	
(c) Applicants for grants under this section:	
(i) must be submitted to the department in writing; and	
(ii) must comply with Subsection (2).	
(2) Applications for grants under this section shall include:	
(a) a statement of specific, measurable objectives, and the methods	s to be used to assess
the achievement of those objectives;	
(b) a description of strategies that will be used to:
