**LONG TITLE**

**General Description:**

This bill modifies the requirements of schools relating to transfer students' records.

**Highlighted Provisions:**

This bill:

- ▶ requires a school that has been requested to forward a copy of a transferring student's record to the new school to comply within 30 days of the request; and
- ▶ makes technical corrections.

**53A-11-504**, as last amended by Chapter 234, Laws of Utah 1993

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

Section 1. Section **53A-11-504** is amended to read:

**53A-11-504. Requirement of school record for transfer of student -- Procedures.**

(1) Within 14 days after enrolling a transfer student, a school shall request, directly from the student's previous school, a certified copy of his record.
