	(1) It is the policy of the state that:
	(a) Utah have adequate, reliable, affordable, sustainable, and clean energy resources;
	(b) Utah will promote the development of:
	(i) nonrenewable energy resources, including natural gas, coal, oil, oil shale, and tar

31	(ii) renewable energy resources, including geothermal, solar, wind, biomass, biodiesel,
32	hydroelectric, and ethanol;
33	(c) Utah will promote the study of nuclear power generation;
34	(d) Utah will promote the development of resources and infrastructure sufficient to
