8 **LONG TITLE**

9 **General Description:**

10 This bill appropriates monies to Utah State University to extend partnerships with other  
11 state institutions of higher education and to enhance regional programs.

12 **Highlighted Provisions:**

13 This bill:

- 14 ▶ appropriates monies to Utah State University to provide increased degree  
15 opportunities in high-demand academic areas;
- 16 ▶ extends Utah State University's partnerships with the College of Eastern Utah,  
17 Snow College, and Weber State University; and
- 18 ▶ develops Utah State University's regional programs at its Uintah Basin, Tooele, and  
19 Brigham City campuses and within the Wasatch Front Region.

20 **Monies Appropriated in this Bill:**

21 This bill appropriates as an ongoing appropriation subject to future budget constraints,  
22 \$7,140,850 from the Education Fund for fiscal year 2007-08 to Utah State University.

23 **Other Special Clauses:**

24 This bill takes effect on July 1, 2007.

28 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

29           Section 1. **Appropriation.**

30           (1) As an ongoing appropriation subject to future budget constraints, there is  
31 appropriated from the Education Fund for fiscal year 2007-08, \$7,140,850 to Utah State  
32 University.

33           (2) It is the intent of the Legislature that the appropriation under Subsection (1) shall be  
34 used by Utah State University as follows:

35           (a) \$1,085,450 to offer education, business, and natural resources degrees at the  
36 College of Eastern Utah;

37           (b) \$1,100,000 to offer education, business, engineering, computer science, and natural  
38 resources degrees at Snow College;

39           (c) \$1,262,410 to offer engineering degrees at Weber State University;

40           (d) \$1,001,125 to offer education, business, preengineering, and natural resources  
41 degrees at the Uintah Basin Campus;

42           (e) \$991,745 to offer education, business, preengineering, and social work degrees at  
43 the Tooele Campus;

44           (f) \$1,179,520 to offer education, preengineering, social work, liberal arts, and family,  
45 consumer, and human development degrees at the Brigham City Campus; and

46           (g) \$520,600 to offer education, business, preengineering, social work, and natural  
47 resources degrees within the Wasatch Front Region.

48           Section 2. **Effective date.**

49           This bill takes effect on July 1, 2007.
