12	provided by the health care provider, and information of any discounts on billed

16	 amends the Health Care Facility Licensing and Inspection Act to require health care
17	facilities licensed under the act to provide a consumer with information regarding
18	certain charges;
19	 amends the Utah Medical Practices Act to require a physician licensed under the act

21	 amends the Utah Osteopathic Medical Practices Act to require osteopathic
22	physicians to provide consumers with information regarding certain charges; and
23	 amends the Dentist and Dental Hygienist Practice Act to require a dentist to provide
