Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

Section 1. **Appropriation to the Centennial Nonmotorized Paths and Trail**



Crossings Program.

(1) As an ongoing appropriation subject to future budget constraints, there is appropriated from the General Fund for fiscal year 2007-08, \$500,000 to the Department of Natural Resources.

(2) It is the intent of the Legislature that the Department of Natural Resources use the monies appropriated in Subsection (1) to fund the Centennial Nonmotorized Paths and Trail Crossings Program created in Section 63-11a-503.
