9	This bill modifies the Election Code to permit election day voter registration.
10	Highlighted Provisions:
11	This bill:
12	<ul> <li>allows individuals to register to vote at their voting precinct's polling place on the</li> </ul>
13	date of the election;
14	<ul> <li>allows voters to change their party affiliation at their voting precinct's polling place</li> </ul>
15	on the date of the election, with certain exceptions for primary elections;
16	<ul> <li>requires county clerks to provide election day registration information to any</li> </ul>
17	individual that seeks to register in person at the county clerk's office after the voter
18	registration deadline has passed and satellite registration has ended;
19	<ul> <li>requires county clerks to provide registration information to any individual that</li> </ul>
20	submits an untimely or incomplete voter registration form by mail, with a driver
21	license form, or through a voter registration agency, and requires the clerk to notify
22	the individual that the individual is not registered; and
23	makes technical changes.
