**LONG TITLE**

**General Description:**

This bill amends the Health Promotion and Risk Reduction chapter of the Health Code.

**Highlighted Provisions:**

This bill:

- ▶ directs the Department of Health to establish a program to educate parents, healthcare providers, and women between the ages of 19 and 26 about the risks of cervical cancer and the prevention of cervical cancer and to begin a cervical cancer immunization program for cervical cancer for women ages 19 to 26.

**Monies Appropriated in this Bill:**

This bill appropriates:

- ▶ as an ongoing appropriation subject to future budget constraints, \$500,000 from the

36 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*

37 Section 1. Section **26-7-3** is enacted to read:

38 **26-7-3. Cervical cancer prevention and wellness program.**

39 The department shall create a program to educate parents, health care providers, and  
40 women between the ages of 19 and 26 about the risk factors associated with cervical cancer and  
41 the prevention of cervical cancer. The department shall provide an immunization program for  
42 cervical cancer for women between the ages of 19 and 26.

43 Section 2. **Appropriation.**

44 As an ongoing appropriation subject to future budget constraints, there is appropriated  
45 from the General Fund for fiscal year 2007-08, \$500,000 to the Department of Health for  
46 establishing the education and immunization program for cervical cancer prevention as  
47 described in Section 26-7-3.
