LONG TITLE

General Description:

This bill amends the Health Promotion and Risk Reduction chapter of the Health Code.

Highlighted Provisions:

This bill:

- ▶ directs the Department of Health to establish a public awareness campaign to educate parents, healthcare providers, and women between the ages of 19 and 26 about the causes and risks of cervical cancer and the prevention of cervical cancer.

Monies Appropriated in this Bill:

This bill appropriates:

- ▶ as an ongoing appropriation subject to future budget constraints, \$25,000 from the General Fund for fiscal year 2007-08 to the Department of Health.

36 Section 1. Section **26-7-3** is enacted to read:

37 **26-7-3. Cervical cancer public awareness campaign.**

38 The department shall create a public awareness campaign to educate parents, health
39 care providers, and women between the ages of 19 and 26 about the causes and risk factors
40 associated with cervical cancer and the prevention of cervical cancer.

41 Section 2. **Appropriation.**

42 As an ongoing appropriation subject to future budget constraints, there is appropriated
43 from the General Fund for fiscal year 2007-08, \$25,000 to the Department of Health for
44 establishing the campaign described in Section 26-7-3.
